

## DEVOTIONS



Transfiguration Sunday serves as a bridge between Epiphany and Lent. Epiphany includes many disciples were to be silent and listen to Jesus. When we think of Jesus' journey to the cross, we, reflects on being a follower who is true to Jesus as Savior and Lord. The transfiguration story in mountain, Elijah and Moses appear with Jesus. This is a scene that perceives the end of history Mark 9 comes amid three accounts of Jesus' suffering and death (Mark 8:31-33, 9:30-32, and coo, as Jesus' disciples are asked to reflect, listen, and humbly grow in our understanding of 10:32-34).
