

The Westminster Standards: Shorter Westminster Catechism

- Q. 1. What is the chief and highest end of humanity?
- A. Humanity's chief and highest end is to glorify God, and fully to enjoy him forever.
- Q. 33. What is justification?
- A. Justification is an act of God's free grace, wherein he pardons all our sins, and accepts us as righteous in his sight, only for the righteousness of Christ imputed to us, and received by faith alone.
- Q. 34. What is adoption?
- A. Adoption is an act of God's free grace, whereby we are received into the number, and have a right to all privileges, of the children of God.
- O. 35. What is sanctification?
- A. Sanctification is the work of God's free grace, whereby we are renewed in the whole person after the image of God, and are enabled more and more to die unto sin and live unto righteousness.
- Q. 36. What are the benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification?
- A. Assurance of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Ghost, increase of grace, and perseverance therein to the end.



CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- Talk or think about a relationship you have with someone that makes you smile.
- God's righteousness is God's loving power to have a relationship to you. How is that relationship with God strengthened for you day after day?

DEVOTIONS



The Gospel of John offers a relational understanding of faith, freedom, and truth. Jesus gives us simply information; it is having a relationship to Jesus who is the truth. Jesus' truth sets people John 1:14). Jesus says, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). Truth is not a living relationship to God daily. Jesus is God in the world with us, the Word made flesh Read: John 8:31-36

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, how can you help others to experience the mercy and love of Christ?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS
