



DEVOTIONS 🕾

Read: John 6:1-21

God's creation produces enough to feed the world. There are times when our own stewardship of God's bounty creates fear that we will not have enough to survive. Some go hungry and suffer poor health while others suffer poor health from consuming too much. In this reading, Jesus takes five loaves and two fish, gives thanks, and feeds five thousand people. He shows the power of giving thanks for God's abundance. This story is about more than gratitude and abundance. It is a sign—a divine example—of the unique character of Jesus that is also seen in Jesus walking on water and bringing the disciples to a safe shore (w. 16-20). Jesus provides the abundant life and safe harbor because of who he is, the Word made flesh, the Son of God who came to save us. He is worthy of our trust and our praise.

Discuss: How does the story of the feeding of the five thousand help you understand God's abundance?

 $P_lay:$ Dear God, take away our fears and give us the joy of life in your presence that we may be filled with generous hearts through Christ Jesus, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

Having enough food to eat is a God-given blessing. Providing a meal and enjoying it with others is a way to celebrate the God of abundance. This week prepare and share a meal with others. Begin the meal by sharing highs and lows with one another. Then start the meal with prayer: Dear God, we give you thanks for the fruit of the earth and for the delight of joining with others to eat and be satisfied. We thank you for the joy of living in your presence through Jesus Christ, the one who fed the five thousand and gives us the abundant life. Amen. After the meal pray the Lord's Prayer together.

The ensemble portion of today's worship music is performed by Alium Spiritum, a classical vocal quartet founded in 2018 by Brookville native Sean Taylor and his wife, Diane, who now live in Brownsville, Texas. They are joined by Lara Alami, from Detroit, Michigan, and Daniel Parks, from Williamsburg, Virginia.


Diane Walters, described as a "clear, beautifully colored soprano" (Broad Street Review) and "sweetly endearing" (Music in Cincinnati), is an artist based in Brownsville, Texas. A specialist in collaborative music and frequent soloist, Diane has sung with ensembles across the country and in Europe including The Crossing, Cincinnati's Vocal Arts Ensemble, Alium Spiritum, Chorosynthesis, RedShift, Taylor Festival Choir, Weimar Bach Cantata Academy, Berwick Chorus of the Oregon Bach Festival, Dallas Choral Festival, and JSB Ensemble of the International Bachakademie Stuttgart. She can be heard on several commercial recordings including the 2022 GRAMMY® nominated recording Rising w/The Crossing. Diane is on the voice faculty at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley. She holds degrees from the Capital University Conservatory of Music and the Boyer College of Music and Dance at Temple University. Diane enjoys knitting, cooking, and spending time with her husband, Sean and daughter, Cecilia.

Lara Alami performs regularly with professional choral ensembles Audivi, Vocal Arts Ensemble Cincinnati, Conspirare, Sounding Light, and has also performed with True Concord Voices and Orchestra, and Oregon Bach Festival. She has sung the contralto role of Vera Boronel in Menotti's The Consul with Opera MODO Detroit. She has also performed with Motor City Lyric Opera, sharing opera with students in Detroit and the surrounding area. Recent highlights as a soloist include the Durufle' Requiem, Ethnic Soloist in Carl Jenkins' Stabat Mater (singing in Aramaic). Lara performs annually for events with Greenfield Singers (Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village in Dearborn, MI). She is soloist and section leader at First Presbyterian Church of Birmingham, MI, and joins the St. John's Episcopal Church of Detroit quartet for the summer season. Lara Alami is a private voice instructor with Rochester Conservatory in Rochester, Michigan. When she isn't singing, she is spending time with her family: husband Faris and their three children. Lara enjoys watercolor and oil painting, having most recently exhibited her work at the Spread Art Gallery in Detroit.

Daniel Edward Parks is a Visiting Assistant Professor of Music and Choral Conducting at William & Mary and the Interim Director of Choirs. He holds degrees from the University of Colorado Boulder (DMA), where he received the Lynn Whitten Fellowship in Graduate Choral Conducting, the University of Minnesota (MM) and Lawrence University (BM). Since joining the Department of Music in 2021, he has conducted the W&M Choir and taught academic courses in music theory and audio production. In the Fall of 2022, he conducted the Barksdale Treble Chorus and Botetourt Chamber Singers as a sabbatical replacement, culminating in a combined performance of Mozart's Requiem in D minor at Commonwealth Auditorium. Daniel was recently named the Artistic Director of the Williamsburg Choral Guild for the upcoming 2023-2024 season. In 2020, he was a finalist in the Graduate Conducting Competition of the Southwestern American Choral Director's Association. As an educator, he taught choral music in Wisconsin schools for five years. He has appeared with a wide variety of choral ensembles in Minnesota, Colorado, and Virginia, and with the professional chamber vocal ensemble Alium Spiritum, based in South Texas.

Pennsylvania native Sean Taylor is Associate Professor of Voice and Director of Choral Studies at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley, conductor of the Valley Symphony Orchestra Chorale, Director of Traditional Music at First Methodist Church in Harlingen Texas, and in September 2024 will assume the role of Director of Music with Berkshire Choral International. A specialist in professional ensemble singing, Sean has sung with Conspirare, Cincinnati's Vocal Arts Ensemble, the Dallas Choral Festival, Charleston's Taylor Festival Choir, The Oregon Bach Festival, and the Choir of Cincinnati's St. Rose Church. Sean earned a DMA in Choral Conducting from the University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music and a Master of Music in Conducting from Carnegie Mellon University, where he served as assistant conductor to Grammy -winning conductor Robert Page. Sean balances his scholarly and artistic work with video games, Batman movies, and preparing for Shark Week with his daughter Cecilia.

Founded in 2018, Alium Spiritum, Latin for "different breath", is devoted to making music relatable to audiences and the community through purposeful, intimate concerts.
