

written in the law. The lawyer gave a good answer that included the importance of loving "your neighbor as yourself" (v. 27). The lawyer fell into his own trap by asking another question: "And ooking good in the exchange with Jesus, the lawyer looked ridiculous. The Samaritan showed who is my neighbor?" (v. 29). He wanted to know who his neighbor was so he could identify A lawyer tried to trick Jesus by asking him, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" v. 25b). Jesus turned the tables and answered the lawyer with a question about what was who to care for. Jesus told the lawyer the parable of the Good Samaritan. In the story, the lawyer, it was the foreigner who showed what it means to be a good neighbor. Instead of Samaritan, a foreigner, was the one who cared for the person in need. Ironically, for the that anyone who needs care is a good candidate to be one's neighbor.
