Focus: Through the Pandemic EBT, all school-aged children that qualify for free and reduced-cost school lunch will receive additional dollars to spend on nutritious foods. If you are enrolled in SNAP, P-EBT will be loaded onto your SNAP EBT card. If you are not enrolled in SNAP, you will receive a separate P-EBT card. Your child will receive this benefit whether they are learning remotely or hybrid. Benefits are distributed in July.
