

THE 2023 ARKHAIOS JURY

JUDY HOFFMAN, JURY PRESIDENT



Judy Hoffman has worked in film and video for 40 years. She was active in the Alternative Television Movement of the early 1970's. During the 1973 International Visual Anthropology Conference, she assisted French ethnographer and filmmaker Jean Rouch, and became deeply influenced by cinéma vérité and the idea of shared anthropology.

Another major and ongoing focus of her work is with the Kwakwaka'wakw First Nation of British Columbia, producing films and videotapes about the reclaiming of Native culture. **Hoffman** was formally adopted by the

Kwakwaka'wakw at the Cranmer potlatch.

Hoffman's cinematography credits include *Lives Visible, Howard Zinn: You Can't be Neutral on a Moving Train; Sacco and Vanzetti; and Nelson Algren: The End is Nothing, The Road is All.*

Hoffman received a VOICE Media Activism Award from Chicago's Center for Community and Media in 1994, and was awarded the 2004 Nelson Algren Committee Award for "community activists making a significant contribution to Chicago life".

She received an MFA from Northwestern University, and recently retired from her position as Professor of Practice in The Arts, in the Department of Cinema and Media Studies at the University of Chicago.

DR. KIMBERLY CAVANAGH



Kimberly Cavanagh is an Associate Professor of Anthropology at the University of South Carolina Beaufort. She holds a PhD in Cultural Anthropology (2013), as well as an MA in Cultural Anthropology (2006), and a Graduate Certificate in Visual Anthropology (2007) from the University of South Carolina. She is the recipient of a Fulbright Scholar Award (2019-2020) and a Fulbright Student Award (2008-2010).

In addition, **Dr. Cavanagh** has worked on archaeological digs in the U.S., Canada, France and Jordan as an excavator and as a project photographer in Jordan over the past 23 years. Most recently, she has begun a research

agenda closer to home, exploring the archaeology of the Barnwell Site --an 18th century tabby building-- on Hilton Head Island, SC.

DR. ROBERT CLIFT



Robert Clift, Ph.D. is a documentary filmmaker and media studies scholar with work appearing on national public television, in film festivals, on new media platforms and in academic publications. His most recent film, *Making Montgomery Clift* (2018), looks at the life and legacy of his uncle, classic Hollywood movie star and queer icon Montgomery Clift. Produced and directed with independent filmmaker Hillary Demmon, the film has played at more than 50 national and international festivals and is slated to be distributed commercially in 2019.

Robert Clift previous films include two nationally broadcast PBS documentaries, *Blacking Up: Hip-Hop's Remix of Race and Identity* (2010) and *Stealing Home: The Case of Contemporary Cuban Baseball* (2001). He is an Associate Professor of Film and Media Studies in the Department of English at the University of Pittsburgh.

DR. KARL HEIDER



Karl G. Heider is a retired Distinguished Professor of Anthropology at the University of South Carolina.

He began his career participating in digs in South Dakota, the classic Mayan site of Tikal, the upper Paleolithic Abri Pataud in France, and led two brief expeditions to a Mesolithic area in Thailand, and with the Minangkabau of West Sumatra, Indonesia.

He made a film, "*Tika*l", pursued ethnographic research with the Dani of Papua, Indonesia, made two more films "*Dani Houses*", "*Dani Sweet Potatoes*". He has written two books on Minangkabau emotion, books on

Ethnographic Film, Indonesian Cinema, and four editions of a textbook, "*Seeing Anthropology. Cultural Anthropology Through Film*".

DR. JONATHAN M. LEADER



Jonathan Leader is the State Archaeologist with the South Carolina Institute of Archaeology and Anthropology at the University of South Carolina, Columbia.

He has conducted research on four continents, the islands of the Western pacific and the Caribbean.

His research interests and background include the ancient Near East, SE Asia, Micronesia, Eastern United States pre and proto-history, submerged resources, cultural resource management, remote sensing, GIS, archaeometry, archaeometallurgy, and objects conservation.

He acts as a consulting SME with government and NGOs for the illicit trade in antiquities, protection of antiquities in conflict zones, and is a forensic archaeological recovery expert.

GUY PERROTTA



Guy Perrotta is a Co-Director/Co-Writer/Co-Producer. Guy has produced, developed, and researched works airing on PBS and elsewhere. He co-directed *Mystic Voices: The Story of the Pequot War*, which aired on PBS. He is a member of the Directors Guild of America (DGA), the National Television Academy (EMMY®), a board member of the Scottish Documentary Institute, and member of The Explorers Club (Fellow, 2016). He has received EMMY® awards for producing and writing, and has presented at conferences on the impact of media on intercultural relationships, most recently on Celtic and Indigenous cultures. His latest work is *Voices Over the Water* concerning tragedy and triumph, stereotypes

and passions. He has aided in developing film festivals and various educational programs. He has taught part-time as a visiting Instructor of cinema and media at the university level.



Yorna's spiritual beliefs revolve around the wandjina creator beings whose images adorn the caves and rock ledges throughout the Kimberlev in Western Australia. Refreshed with new ochre each year by his ancestors the wandjinas are now fading away with the absence of Yorna's people.

But the community's decision to allow one of Yorna's designs to appear at the 2000 Sydney Olympics opening ceremony empowers a progressive new perspective. Yorna is compelled to visit the big-boss wandjina NAMARALI in his cave. His mission: to repaint the imposing 4m wandjina image with fresh ochre and restore NAMARALI back to his full glory.

On a distant, inaccessible section of the West Kimberley coast, the film is witness to the radical action of a man and his community determined to bring their deity 'back to life'.

NAMARALI was created over 20 years by Tim Mummery and senior knowledge



keeper Yorna Woolagoodja (2021 Red Ochre lifetime achievement award).

He then directed a short documentary in Rwanda, Sonatubes-Nyanza (26', 2012, Corsicadoc, Entrevues Belfort parallel program), Le Kaddish des Orphelins in Israel with the writer survivor of the Shoah Aharon Appelfeld (52', 2016, Dublin Films, France TV L'heure D, étoile de la Scam) and the feature film L'enfance d'Aharon (2018, Dublin Films, Cinema Jueu Festival in Barcelona, Flickers Roving Eye in Rhodes Island). He then shot for four years in Poland a film on the memorialization of the Holocaust the on the site of extermination center of Sobibor.





Megaliths are monumental buildings made of earth and stone with a length of up to 150 meters. However, unlike the stone circles from southern England, which attract tourists from all over the world, only a small group of scientists know about them in Poland.

The history that took place in our lands over five thousand years ago had to be told for many reasons. It is part of the European heritage that we should promote not only in Poland, but also in the world. It is part of our ancient culture that should be brought closer to Polish society, it is practically unknown to them. All this is part of the extraordinary cognitive value of the film.

Thanks to the film, we go back more than 5 millennia. Thanks to the locations, scenography, reconstructors, 3D animation, precisely planned frames, we see a world that has long ceased to exist.

As a part of the docufiction series ArcheoCuisine, the show "Roman Banguet" Weddina represents maturing of boys and girls during the Roman times, up to the very act of marriage. Roman hedonism is at its peak at the wedding banquet and it blends the most exotic ingredients and aromas. The show was filmed in an authentic location with the enormous support of Archeologic Park the Viminacium.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Milica Popovic graduated in Archeology and obtained a master's degree from the Faculty of Philosophy in Belgrade. She has been a member of the Serbian Archeological Society for almost two decades. She participated in more than 30 archaeological researches, of which the most important sites are Vinca, Gamzigrad, Sarkamen, Zidovar, Salitrena pecina. She participates in the multi-year project Jadar implemented by Archaeological Institute in Belgrade, and Brooklyn College, City University of New York, USA.

As a conservator of pottery, she participated in numerous exhibitions, with the most famous being: The archaeological Treasure of Kosovo and Metohija in SANU, Židovar treasure, Blagotin, and part of the material in the permanent exhibition of the Valjevo Museum and Museum of Jadar in Loznica.

She is also a member of the RTS choir as part of Music Production, and as of November 2020, she became an editor at the Science Editorial Office of the RTS Educational and Scientific Program. There she is dedicated to the topics of archeology and cultural heritage. She is the author of the series ArcheoDiscoveries, the docufiction series ArcheoCuisine, and the show dedicated to the 75th Anniversary of UNESCO.



USA PREMIERE ROUNDELS – THE 7,000-YEAR-OLD MYSTERY

Director Krzysztof Paluszynski Producer Andrzej Paluszyzński PFS PalFilmStudio, (Poland), 2021, 54 min.

This fictionalized documentary is a kind of story - a journey through the lands of Poland and Europe almost 7,000 years ago, which directly translates into a high cognitive and educational value of the film. Thanks to the locations, set design, reconstructors, 3D animation, precisely planned frames, we see a world that has long since ceased to exist. This type of does not exist Polish film in cinematography.

The starting point for the film are the relatively poorly recognized and researched roundels, which are the oldest, dating back 7000 years, examples of monumental architecture in Europe. They were built e.g. in Hungary, the Czech Republic, Austria, Germany and, most importantly, in today's Polish lands. In total, over 180 of them have been discovered in Europe.

In 2014, only three structures of this type were recognized in Poland, now there are at least 5 of them, on a circular plan, erected using simple tools by the community of the oldest farmers who came to the lands of present-day Poland from the Danube area. Their construction began around 4900 BC. After about 200-300 years of functioning, they disappeared.

In the opinion of Professor Lech Czerniak, rondelles were a new social institution in Central Europe, the invention of which played a key role in the formation of a new social order after the collapse of the culture of the first farmers at the beginning of the 5th millennium BC.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Krzysztof Paluszyński - Television and film producer, screenwriter, director. Member of the Polish Filmmakers Association. Creator of numerous audiovisual productions. Documentary films, reportages, columns and documentary productions.

The director received the third prize at the Zamość Film Festival - "Meetings with History" for the film "Megaliths - History from 5,500 years ago" and distinctions at the "Edukino" educational film festival for the film "Anton Szulczyński - a painter from birth", and the film "Polychromia Turkowska - the greatness of Józef Mehoffer's talent". Recent movies are "Rondels - a great riddle from 7000 years ago" and "Bronze halberd - a symbol of civilization change".



SURVIVING THE ASTEROID: THE DARKEST HOUR

Director Thomas Cirotteau Producers Fabrice Frank, Céline Payot Lehmann Pernel Media, with Ushuaïa TV and NHK, and France Televisions, (France), 2022, 2x45 min.

What is the origin of the animals and plants that inhabit our planet ? How did life rebuild itself after the asteroid that wiped out the dinosaurs and killed 75% of the world's species 66 million years ago ? Why did some species survive while others succombed ?

These answers have long been shrouded in mystery, because finding fossils dating to this period is rare. But extraordinarily now an astonishing discovery in Colorado is rewriting history. American paleontologist Tyler Tyson and his team have uncovered a series of unique fossils that offer an unprecedented insight into the rebirth of life after the meteorite.

For the first time, scientists can lift the veil on the origin of the species we know today, tracing their ancestors back to the survivors of this cataclysm. "Surviving the Asteroid" follows the work of these scientists with exclusive access to the digging site in Colorado and plunges the viewer into the lost world of these creatures, brought back to life with spectacular CGI. Their astounding story is also that of the origins of life today.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

After studying science at the University Paris VI, and graduating from ENS Louis Lumière, Thomas Cirotteau received the Kieslowski Award in 2001 for Best Script, for the movie HIROMI. In 2016, Jacques Malaterre put him in charge of an episode of the series 'Unsung Heroes' (26', Arte, 2016): 'Jeannette Mac Donald, a lioness among lions'.

His most recent works include 'Who killed the Neanderthal?' (90', France 5, 2017, co-written with Eric Pincas and Jacques Malaterre), 'Lady Sapiens' (90', France 5, 2021), 'Pierrette en Terre animale' (first work of fiction using a video game engine, 2020) and 'After the Meteorite: the Asteroid Survivors' (90', France 5, 2022, co-written with Eric Pincas).

Natália is a 75 year old Portuguese crafts woman, who struggles to maintain the art of the bulrush mats. Ever since her early days, in a time and place that knew no abundance, the bulrush was a central piece of a simple way of living. Her life and her craft intertwine and blend in a magic realism documentary.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Pedro Cruz, born in 1983, is a Portuguese director and sound editor. With a degree in Psychology and a degree in Documentary Cinema, he directed "Farewell to the river" - Best Short Film at Festival Luso-brasileiro de Sta Maria da Feira 2018, and Honorable Mention for Best Doc. at Caminhos do Cinema Português, 2017; and "The Pleasant Feeling of Being in a More Innocent Age - Paul Bowles' Impressions on Portugal" screened at Leffest 2017.


