## Brent E. Huffman's "Saving Mes Aynak" Pre-Festival Free Streaming, September 5-8, 2024

*Pittsburgh, PA* - Arkhaios Cultural Heritage and Archaeology Film Festival proudly presents a special four-day stream of the award-winning documentary "*Saving Mes Aynak*", directed and produced by Filmmaker and Professor Brent E. Huffman.

"Saving Mes Aynak" chronicles the fight to save a 5,000-year-old city in Afghanistan from imminent destruction by a Chinese government-owned mining company. This company is set to mine for 100 billion dollars' worth of copper located directly under the ancient site. Mes Aynak is home to some of the oldest Buddhist temples, stupas, statues, oil paintings, and written texts in the world. Mining will destroy the ancient city as well as permanently pollute the environment of the area. Tragically, mining began in early August, 2024.

The ancient Buddhist city of *Mes Aynak*, Afghanistan is under imminent threat of destruction as mining commences. [https://tolonews.com/afghanistan-189861]. This four-day screening of an updated version of "*Saving Mes Aynak*" is happening to raise awareness about this incredible and priceless heritage, to celebrate the work of Afghan archaeologists who risked their lives to save it, and to raise awareness in order to stop mining from ever happening at or around the ancient city.

The 2014 original version of the film has been enhanced this year with a new ending to reflect the current situation at *Mes Aynak*. Arkhaios Film Festival is proud to present this documentary for free around the world on September 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th.

Professor and Director Brent E. Huffman will give a video update about the current situation at *Mes Aynak* to be included in the stream.

The documentary, and Huffman's update on *Mes Aynak*, will be streamed on the Arkhaios Film Festival site, as a special event, before the Arkhaios Film Festival which is taking place later on October 14-20, 2024.
