EXPLORING RELIGIOUS TOLERANCE

“What everyone needs to know about antisemitism” offers an introduction to antisemitism exploring how antisemitism has evolved across religious, racial, and political contexts, with attention to the persistence of anti-Jewish narratives. Learn how antisemitism manifests today across the ideological spectrum, including conspiracy narratives, Holocaust distortion, and the use of coded language that draws on longstanding tropes about Jewish power and influence. The goal is to equip participants with historical context, analytical tools, and practical insights that support informed and constructive engagement in their congregational and civic settings.



Douglas Greene is the Director of the Jewish Community Relations Council at the Jewish Federation of Greater Charlotte. He leads the Federation's work in public affairs, interfaith relations, and the strategic response to antisemitism across the region.

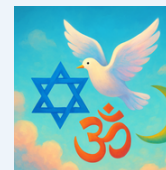

A former secondary English educator with a specialization in Holocaust education, Douglas has dedicated his career to advancing historical literacy and strengthening civic dialogue around issues of antisemitism and Jewish identity. He is the founder and facilitator of the North Carolina Jewish Coalition, a statewide initiative that brings together Jewish communities to coordinate advocacy, education, and community relations efforts.

A Call to Action

- Reflect on how language related to Jews, Judaism, and Israel is used within congregational and community settings, with attention to avoiding rhetoric that echoes harmful historical tropes.
- Build or expand relationships with local Jewish institutions and leaders through dialogue, shared learning, and community engagement.
- Be prepared to speak out and stand with Jewish communities when antisemitic incidents occur, both locally and more broadly.
