New Year Charity Outreach

On 1 January 2026, the I.B. Taylor-Kamara Foundation inaugurated the new year with a Charity Outreach at the Youth Centre in Pujehun Town, Sierra Leone. The initiative delivered meals and gifts to underprivileged and orphaned children, reaffirming the Foundation's enduring commitment to dignity, compassion, and community-centred humanitarian action.

This outreach represents a core component of the Foundation's strategic response to vulnerability during periods of acute social and economic pressure. By placing children at the heart of the programme, the Foundation signalled a clear institutional priority for 2026: that care for the most vulnerable constitutes a fundamental responsibility rather than a discretionary concern.

The event convened children, caregivers, volunteers, and community leaders in a programme designed both to address immediate welfare needs and to strengthen broader social cohesion. Central to the initiative were the values of respect, inclusion, and collective responsibility in advancing child welfare outcomes.

The outreach was delivered through strategic partnerships with International Adolescent Health Sierra Leone and Youth in Livestock Productions Sierra Leone, demonstrating a collaborative approach grounded in local engagement and shared accountability.

The event brought together children, caregivers, volunteers, and community leaders in a programme designed to meet immediate welfare needs while also reinforcing social cohesion.

At the core of the initiative were the principles of respect, inclusion, and collective responsibility, which guided efforts to advance sustainable child welfare outcomes.
