

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear St. Luke's Family and Friends,

November 4, 2024

Another chicken dinner has come and gone; we not only survived, we thrived! Thanks to the efforts of each of our volunteers, we were able to serve 500 chicken dinners – a complete sell out. I am so grateful for those who purchased chickens, organized the plan, prepared food, or served in the parking lot, kitchen, or serving hall. We were blessed with a beautiful day, but my true blessing came from all of you. Well done!

We now look toward the holiday season in the weeks ahead, but before we arrive there, I would like to point out two important events in the life of the church. First, on Sunday, November 17th, we will formally welcome five new members into our fellowship during morning worship. You may have already met Dawne, Graham, Rhonda, Dave, and Wendy, but I hope you will plan to worship with us that morning as we renew our covenant as members of St. Luke's together.

A couple of weeks later, on Sunday, December 1, we will finally be able to celebrate my official installation as pastor and teacher of St. Luke's UCC. The Committee on Ministry of the St. Louis Association has approved my process and application for my ordination to be recognized by the United Church of Christ – my original ordination was in the Baptist church more than 25 years ago – and everything becomes official at a special installation service at 3pm on Sunday, December 1. UCC clergy from throughout the association will be invited to attend, as will representatives from the Missouri Mid-South Conference. You will find an invitation to attend the service and meal to follow in this newsletter; please contact our church office to make a reservation as we want to make sure we have space for everyone.

A few of you have expressed interest in attending my next bible study as we have recently concluded "Gospel Parables" via Zoom on Thursday evenings. I've truly enjoyed this study and I hope you have as well. I'm looking at starting something new after the first of the year, and I will likely offer both a daytime, in-person gathering and an evening, Zoom gathering, as well. We seem to have enough interest in both, and I'm glad to share the time. Look for more information, coming soon!

Finally, I hope you will take the opportunity to stop by the church office or give us a call to welcome our new secretary, Stephanie Morlan. I'll let her introduce herself in this newsletter, but I'm thrilled to count her as part of our St. Luke's team. Be patient with her – she has to learn how to work with me!
