

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

St. Luke's Church Friends and Family,

If April showers bring May flowers, does May bring relief from the rain? I think that's how the phrase goes, anyway. As we look for a break in the Spring storm season, we recognize May will be a very busy and important time in the life of our church. I hope you and your family will be a part of it all.

In worship, I will be following the lectionary texts through the Acts of the Apostles in a sermon series I'm calling "Easter Surprise." We began last Sunday, April 27; here's what's coming in the weeks ahead:

ANNOUNCEMENTS

CHURCH COUNCIL ANNOUNCEMENTS

Church Council is proposing a By-law change to Article 4, #1 and #2 at a Congregation meeting in June. Details will be available following the April Council meeting.

Original By-laws

Article 4: Congregational Meetings

- 1. The annual meeting of the congregation shall be held at the church property on the third Sunday of January of each year at the hour of 2:00 P.M.
- 2. Special meetings may be called by the Council or upon the written request of four percent (4%) of the voting members. The Council shall issue a call for such a meeting within two weeks after the request had been received. This meeting shall be held within thirty days after a written notice to each member in good standing is given of time, place and purpose of special congregational meetings.

Proposed changes to By-laws

Article 4: Congregational Meetings

- 1. The annual meeting of the congregation shall be held at the church property on the third Sunday of January of each year, after the church service at a time set by the Church Council 30 days in advance.
- 2. Special meetings may be called by the Council or upon the written request of four percent (4%) of the voting members. The Council shall issue a call for such a meeting within two weeks after the request

had been received. This meeting shall be held within thirty days after notification, electronic or written notice, to each member in good standing is given of time, place and purpose of special congregational meetings.

• Church Council is addressing the following projects and encourages the congregation to continue reporting any church maintenance concerns to a council member or the office.
