

Meeting Highlight; from July 2021 Meeting;

Church Council met a few times in the month of July to discuss various topics needing to be addressed/approved. Minutes from May and June were reviewed and approved.

<u>Financial</u>: Sandy Arnold will meet Becky at the bank to be added as a signer on the bank account. Financial reports were reviewed and approved. The contingency fund, endowment fund and memorial fund are being reviewed.

<u>Building and Grounds Committee</u>: The Sanctuary HVAC unit has a bad computer board and needs to be replaced. The thermostat in the quilting room is bad. The total to complete the replacement and work will be \$3900. Dwight is also working on bids for the security camera system and will be moving forward with getting that installed. Bids received for asphalt paving, to pave from the bridge to the rock road, cut out bad spots and replace with new asphalt.

Endowment Committee: Meeting scheduled for August 2nd.

<u>Church Events</u>: Rally Day is scheduled for Sunday, August 29th and Council is responsible for all inside games and prizes.

Search Committee: First meeting scheduled for Monday, August 2nd. A Chairperson will be elected at that time.

<u>Funeral / Wedding Procedures:</u> The current typed office procedures were provided by Tricia and Linda Schrepel has volunteered to review and suggest revisions. Linda will also meet with Tricia to discuss how to handle calls to the office regarding a funeral or wedding.

<u>COVID Protocols:</u> (see "President's Message"). Council discussed and for now things are staying the way they have been. Recommendation to have all children wearing a mask currently. Council will continue to monitor changes and if things change moving forward, may have to reinstate some distance precautions in the Sanctuary but plans to keep congregation updated.

<u>Congregational Meeting:</u> Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, August 8th directly following service to discuss parking lot renovations and bylaw addendums.



Meeting Minutes from July 13, 2021

The Board of Elders held their regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, July 13, 2021. Minutes from the June 8th meeting were reviewed and approved.

Normally the Board of Elders do not have a July meeting however last month agreed to have a July meeting to discuss Shepherding Groups. As the discussion began, the Elders discussed:

- a) The definition of a shepherding group
- b) The purpose of group
- c) Would they contact only non-active members of the church?
- d) How many shepherds would be needed?
- e) Who would Chair the group?

Pastor Josh suggested that it may be better to hold this topic until after a new Pastor was hired and able to work with the Board of Elders on this and that maybe at this time efforts should focus on our church family and the needs of the community around St. Luke's.

- a) What should the mission of St. Luke's be?
- b) What do we want St. Luke's to be?

To bring our church closer, we should be having at least one fun, not a lot of work, simple event per month. Ideas tossed around were a choir show/sing along, bingo night, movie night, family campout (in the cemetery on Halloween?), do more with local schools, ice cream truck, pancake breakfast (where they catch the pancakes), prepare care packages for "Our Military Personnel" as listed in the weekly bulletins.

To start planning, the Board of Elders will work closely with the Board of Christian Education to coordinate some events and ideas. Jess McLard will get the ball rolling by contacting Connie Stuckmeyer.

Another topic discussed since the Board was meeting was how prayer requests will now be handled during Sunday Worship Service. The Ushers are now going to collect prayer requests during the hymn right after the sermon and deliver them to Pastor Josh before the Pastoral prayer/Lord's Prayer. Pastor and Elders plan to better manage and monitor the prayer list monthly.

Board of Christian Education

Meeting Minutes from July 6, 2021

The Board of Christian Education met on Tuesday, July 6th for their regularly scheduled meeting. Minutes from the June 1, 2021, meeting was reviewed and approved.

Sunday School: Gail submitted a 2021 Fall classroom list. Sunday School has been going well.

Church Council: The Search Committee is organized and will be electing a chairperson. In preparation for the congregational meeting on August 8th, Connie submitted a bylaw revision request pertaining to the age of confirmation. It will remain the same but with the following addendum: "Pending yearly evaluation of class size to allow the addition of children entering 7th grade and upon the discretion of the children's parents and the acting minister".

Confirmation: BOCE is currently putting together our motion for the bylaw addendum concerning confirmation for the congregational meeting. Pastor Pittman will confirm with Tricia that the letter is sent to all two weeks prior to the meeting and will include the content for the addendum. Pastor Pittman to arrange an agreeable class time to begin meeting in September, review expectations and a calendar/syllabus and letters will be mailed to possible confirmands pending addendum approval.

Voyagers / Youth Group: Kathy Porter suggested inviting Cindy Burke to a meeting, she is a good resource to help develop Youth Groups. Suggested to invite kids from other churches to join us for activities. Seeking a youth group/voyager sponsor.

Quarterly Mission: BOCE's 2nd quarter mission, Crisis Nursery, received congregational donations of \$74 and Sunday School donations of \$142.87, totaling \$216.87. The money has been deposited and a check will be written to Crisis Nursery. Angie will obtain the contact information. Designated mission for 3rd quarter is Brenden's Backpack.

VBS: There were 49 students enrolled as of 7/6/21 with the largest percentage being non-members. Many of the volunteers include past confirmands and older Sunday School students. There will be a children's bible story skit from VBS week, along with presentation of activities and singing songs they learned during worship service on Sunday, July 11th

Rally Day/All Church Picnic: Discussed planning details for August 29th, and committee assignments.

Other Events Upcoming: Planning to begin for Fall Festival, Gary Cronin has agreed to be Santa for our Santa's breakfast on December 4th. Sarah presented ideas to celebrate Grandparents Day September 12th with a "Goodies for Grands".

Sanctuary Lighting and Sanctuary HVAC...

In the July Beacon, we informed everyone of recent upgrades and repairs that became necessary for the church's Sanctuary lighting and HVAC. The total cost for the lighting project was \$5318.66 and the Sanctuary HVAC unit replacement and maintenance / repairs to other units for the building totaled \$4400. At that time, we asked that anyone interested in helping offset the cost of these projects to please mark your donation as a "Church Lighting" or "Church HVAC" donation. WE DID IT! We collected \$5600 in our Sanctuary Lighting fund which surpassed the unexpected costs we faced. We have also collected \$550 towards offsetting the HVAC costs.

SUNDAY SCHOOL - 3RD QUARTER MISSION

The Sunday School 3rd Quarter Mission will run from July through September. Sunday School will be collecting for Brenden's Backpack.

Hunger can affect anyone, and hundreds of children in our area suffer every day. These can be children in your neighborhood, children that your child sits next to every day at school or children your child plays with at the park. These children do not look forward to the weekends and long school breaks because often they know that they may not have much to eat until they go back to school. School food programs only provide free breakfast and lunch during the week but many times these families struggle to put food on the table over the weekend.

Brenden's Friday Backpacks began in 2011 with 4 children in a single school and has grown to a program that currently feeds over 1400 children in 68 schools throughout Jefferson County and in St. Francois County on a weekly basis during the school year. Every Friday, each child takes home a bag of single-serve, non-perishable, kid-friendly foods that can be easily prepared and last until the child returns to school the next week. The program is run entirely by volunteers and takes anonymous referrals directly from local schools.

FESTIVAL OF SHARING

Women's Guild is collecting personal hygiene kits. There are plastic bags with the list of requested items placed in the Narthex for pickup. These bags will be collected both in the Narthex and Fellowship Hall. We ask that the items have lids tightened and placed into the large Ziploc bags provided. Thank you.
