

## President's Message

Hello Church families,

The CDC has changed things recently regarding their guidelines and so St. Luke's Church Council met and have decided ... .so are we! I cannot thank you all enough for your patience through this everchanging situation over the past year. Our main goal is to continue keeping everyone as safe and comfortable as we can. We are asking that everyone please proceed with caution..we all know this is not completely over. I think we could agree that everyone at St. Luke's, just wants to be back to normal and I want you to know that your Church Council is doing the best they can to get us there.

First, to move forward following CDC changes, we are no longer mandating that masks must be worn while in church, however we are recommending that if anyone is not vaccinated, immunocompromised or just uncomfortable not wearing a mask, to please continue to wear your mask while in attendance.

Second, the reservation system has been disabled at this time, it is no longer required to reserve seats each week with the Church Office or via Signup Genius.

Lastly, seating has been opened more. The far side of the Sanctuary and Balcony are fully open. The piano side of the Sanctuary will remain every other pew for those who wish to maintain a bit more distance still.

On another note, after two long weeks of Tricia trying out a new adventure, she realized that St. Luke's was her family. I am here to tell you that our Church office OPENED as of Monday, May 24th and Tricia has returned. Please welcome her back to our family. She will be in the office on Mondays and Wednesdays with additional time flexed later in the week to complete weekly tasks such as printing our Sunday bulletins.

I know this past year has been hard on us all in many, different ways. I would like to take a moment to thank all of you who have sent in your regular contributions to St. Luke's during this time of distance. Last year we were granted assistance with our payroll and insurance expenses to help fill the gap since we missed out on so much. This year so far, we do not have that assistance and we are experiencing a deficit. We would appreciate any extra monetary help if you are able. Mail has resumed being sent to church so there is no further worry about monies not being received via post office transit.

To wrap up, if you are interested in being a part of the Search Committee organizing to meet and seek our new permanent Pastor, please reach out to me. We are in need of volunteers for this. Thank you all for your dedication to St. Luke's as we have maneuvered this difficult time.

### Meeting Minutes from May 18, 2021

The Church Council met on Tuesday, May 18<sup>th</sup> for their regularly scheduled meeting. Minutes from the April 20<sup>th</sup> meeting were reviewed and approved.

<u>Amendment to Re-Open Plan</u>: CDC updated current guidelines so those were reviewed, and Council decided to remove the mask mandate as well as open seating in the Sanctuary on half of the pews. Motions were made to amend current guidelines. (See President's Message)

<u>Financial</u>: Sandy Arnold will be attending future meetings to assist with Treasurer's duties. Due to circumstances last year and no grant assistance with church expenditures this year as well as less donations due to restricted worship attendance, St. Luke's is facing a 25k deficit currently.

<u>Building and Grounds Committee</u>: The lighting in the Sanctuary is complete. The parsonage was exterminated. The facia has been repaired from damage caused by birds. The tankless water heater will need to be serviced every year. Dwight will be servicing in the next week or two. The front steps have been power washed and the parking lot graded. Dwight continues to obtain quotes for a church security system.

**Endowment Committee:** Will be holding a meeting on May 25<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in Fellowship Hall.

<u>Worship:</u> Reviewed how worship services are going every Sunday. The Zoom meeting/hybrid in-person worship services are going well.

<u>Church Events</u>: Sarah Saputo is working on plans for Rally Day. The Board of Elders will be in charge of food and Church Council will be asked to assist with indoor games. VBS is being planned and will be announced soon.

<u>Church Office/Secretary</u>: Review of reinstatement of Tricia Heckstetter as Church Secretary. Tricia will be returning to the office effective May 24, 2021. The church office will be open on Monday and Wednesday each week.

<u>Search Committee</u>: Working on compiling a list of church volunteers to serve on the search committee. Once this committee is established, they will self-elect a chairperson and secretary to report minutes. The chairperson will work with Church Council President and Rev. Damien Lake to begin the process of reviewing candidates and provide guidance.

**Confirmation Class:** Confirmation has been set for Sunday, May 16<sup>th</sup> during the regular 9am service. The class is ready. The 2021 class is: Kaylin Hollerbach, Olivia Raebel and Elizabeth Skaggs.

Baptisms: May 9th, Mariella Saputo, daughter of Michael and Sarah Saputo was baptized.

**Funerals/Memorial Services:** Herb Conway, Madge Klable, Vernon Kramme and Mary Sue Kraus. All services were held at a funeral home.

**Membership:** In preparation for the search for a new full-time Pastor, Elders will be updating the membership roll. In order to make this difficult process a bit easier, will be looking into the bylaws for working as to what defines who is a member. After a good definition is determined, it will be presented to Council to update the bylaws accordingly.

<u>Prayer List</u>: The "Thoughts and Prayers" section in the bulletin and Beacon needs to be reviewed periodically. There are currently 30 names listed, 16 of which are not members of St. Luke's. The questions is: "do all of these names need to remain indefinitely on the list?"

### Board of Christian Education

### Meeting Minutes from May 4, 2021

The Board of Christian Education met on Tuesday, May 4<sup>th</sup> for their regularly scheduled meeting. Minutes from the April 6, 2021 meeting were reviewed and approved.

**Sunday School:** Reported to be working well. The first four Sundays there has been between 9 and 13 students in attendance. Curriculum has been delivered for June through August.

**Church Council:** Safety protocols have been further relaxed: bibles, hymnals and seat cushions added back to the Sanctuary, singing is allowed, and additional pews have been opened for seating.

**Confirmation:** All items have been obtained and are ready for Confirmation Sunday, May 16<sup>th</sup>.

Voyagers / Youth Group: Remains on hold.

**Youth Group:** There has been some discussion regarding group meetings/activities, how often to plan events (monthly or quarterly), reaching out to past confirmands, and promoting events.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Mission**: Designated mission for 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter is Crisis Nursery. A collection jar is placed in each classroom and in the Sanctuary.

VBS: Discovery on Adventure Island: Safety protocols will be written and made available for review by Sarah Saputo. Some of the guidelines may include: a sanitation station at the entrance with motion sensor hand sanitizer, mask requirement, a waiver will be included on the registration form, small classes will be divided and sectioned for opening/closing, snacks will be served by gloved individuals from carts brought to seated children, and hard surfaces will be cleaned/sanitized. Advertisement will be Facebook page, the Leader, church bulletin, banners on the bridge and possibly "yard style" signs. Pastor Pittman suggested to post a video representing a challenge, game or activity for the first day. Chris will prepare a registration/waiver form.

**Rally Day/All Church Picnic:** Will be planned activities for all ages. Some additional kid activities might include a bounce slide, obstacle course, or a dunk booth. Food could be catered or brought in by each individual family. Further planning is needed. Church Council, Board of Elders and BOCE will divide responsibilities.


# Building & Grounds
