Happy May Church families,

This has been a busy month for Church Council, to say the least! As some of you may know by now, Tricia informed us that she has accepted a full-time position outside of our church, her last working day will be Thursday, May 6th, 2021. Along with her resignation as our Church Secretary, Tricia has offered to help us with several tasks therefore will stay an employee of St. Luke's, working evening hours as needed until a new Church Secretary is hired.

I would like to thank Tricia for her hard work and dedication over the two years she has been with St. Luke's. She has been an amazing asset to our church, and we can't thank her enough for keeping us all together. Also, a huge thank you for working with us during this transition. As of May 7th, a Church Council member will be filtering through emails until a new Church Secretary is hired.

As far as updates, I have many for May....

Pastor - Please welcome Pastor Pittman in the Sanctuary Sunday, May 2nd!!!

<u>Worship Service Reservations</u> - Please continue to make reservations for Sunday service at this time. This allows us to make sure we are properly prepared for attendance each week. You can make reservations by visiting the church's website and clicking the link to the Signup Genius website.

<u>Worship Entrance / Restroom Use</u> – Effective, May 1st, we will be opening the main doors to enter the Sanctuary through the Narthex. We also will be adding an additional usher to take attendance and collect waivers, as necessary. This decision was made to try and keep the piano area less crowded. The Educational building restroom use only for Fellowship hall attendees is amended to allow use for Sunday school. The upstairs restroom remains open for Sanctuary attendees.

<u>Social Distancing, Mask Mandate & Sanitizer</u> – Please continue to social distance. I know most are fully vaccinated at this point, but we are still trying to stay safe and make everyone feel comfortable. We ask that you respect the mask mandate, always wearing them. Sanitizer remains available for your use upon entry and exit of the Sanctuary.

Seating – The available pews in the Sanctuary have been revised to allow more seating. We will now have every other pew on both sides open (1, 3, 5, 7, 9) with the ability to add folding chairs behind pew 10 on both sides when needed. You will notice some modifications will be made to the seating plans to accommodate bigger family groups for special occasions **only**, at this point.

<u>Communion Sunday/Offering</u> – These areas will remain the same. If it is a Communion Sunday, we will continue with "BYO" (bring your own) communion elements. The offering plate will be at the entrance to receive your offering.

<u>Cushions/Books / Singing</u> – Effective May 1st, you will notice pew cushions, hymnals and bibles have returned to the Sanctuary. Regarding singing...Yes, you may sing again!!!! You might find a few more Choir Members in the loft area, also.

<u>Church Groups / Events</u> – Sunday School reopened on April 11th, 2021 after Service with approved guidelines. The Church Quilters have been approved to return. They will be able to finish the quilt they started two years ago! Vacation Bible School and Rally Day/All Church Picnic plans are in the works!

The Church Council met on Tuesday, April 20th for their regularly scheduled meeting. Minutes from the March 16th meeting were reviewed and approved.

<u>Amendment to Re-Open Plan</u>: All current guidelines were reviewed along with requests and suggestions to open up more and allow the return of items to worship services. Motions were made to amend current guidelines. (See President's Message)

<u>Building and Grounds Committee</u>: The upstairs classrooms and hallway have been freshly painted. The Parsonage deck was washed and stained. All HVAC outside units have been cleaned. Currently looking at quotes for installation of security cameras. An ice maker has been installed at the parsonage. Harold and Peggy Burton (renters) have requested use of the parking lot on May 14th for a birthday party.

<u>Cemetery Committee</u>: Warren has been talking with Garry Dale and Derek Ehlers. He is looking to setup a meeting with Becky/Tim and Treasurer so that more than one person knows what is going on with the cemetery. A request has been received for a graveside memorial service in June. Warren, Garry and Pastor will be in contact with the family and finalize arrangements.

<u>Worship:</u> Reviewed how worship services are going every Sunday. The Zoom meeting/hybrid in-person worship services are going well.

<u>Membership:</u> One death reported, Herb Conway (4/1/21). Church records have been updated in the office.

<u>Church Events</u>: Sunday School reopened on Sunday 4/11/21 after service. Requests to move forward with planning VBS (July 5-9, 2021) and Rally Day/All Church Picnic in August were approved.

<u>Resignation</u>: Tricia Heckstetter submitted her resignation on Monday, April 19th. Her last day working in the Church Office will be Thursday, May 6th, 2021. Meeting Minutes from April 6, 2021

The Board of Christian Education met on Tuesday, April 6th for their regularly scheduled meeting. Minutes from the March 2, 2021 meeting were reviewed and approved.

Sunday School: Connie continues recording the Children's Message which are being played during Sunday's worship service. Recordings of the service can be found on the St. Luke's website. In person Sunday School will resume on April 11, 2021. The recorded message will continue to be played during service with children attending class from 10:00-10:30 a.m. The three upstairs Sunday School classrooms have been repainted. The hallway will be painted this week.

Confirmation: Confirmands are working on finalizing their Statement of Faith, robes have been ordered by Tricia, Chrissy is working on ordering corsages, engraved leather bibles and U.C.C necklaces. Connie is working on ordering wine glasses. Confirmation Sunday is May 16th.
