

Meeting Highlight; from February 2022

Church Council met on February 15, 2022, at 6:30 p.m. Minutes were reviewed and approved from the January meeting.

Financial: Discussion regarding accounts with monies that could be accruing interest and could be transferred out to help grow the funds. The balances remaining in funds give enough to still operate successfully. The rep from United Church Funds will be invited back to a meeting to provide recommendations for funds and amounts. The Financial Secretary's report was given and announced that there were no employment wage / merit increases approved for the 2022 year.

Building & Grounds: Dwight Kraus reported the new sign at New Hwy M and St. Luke's Church Road would be replaced before the Sausage Dinner by Ehlman Signs for the cost of \$475.00. A donation was made to the Church to cover the costs of the sign.

Search Committee: The committee has reviewed the church profile. They need one more reference letter from a non-member. They have two but would like three.

Endowment: Warren Stuckmeyer reported that the Endowment Committee approved the request for \$500 to the Board of Christian Education for supplies for the year. They also approve the request from Women's Guild to purchase signs for the Chicken Dinner. Endowment is still processing requests for the 2020 distribution year. They will continue to accept applications until April for the May meeting.

Board of Christian Education: Kathy Porter requested approval from Council to rename the Annual Halloween parade to the "Fall for Jesus Festival." Council approved.

Board of Elders: The BOE requests that they take over the responsibility for the Zoom process, setting up the equipment etc. on Sunday morning for service. BOE provided Council a list of "nonactive" members that have been contacted or attempted contact to verify whether they wished to remain "affiliate" members or to be removed from the church roster. The BOE will review the list two times per year to keep up with the process. An "affiliate" is one who does not attend church, does not make a donation of time or funds to the church. A motion was made and passed to move "inactive" members to the appropriate lists as per BOE recommendation. BOE is requesting the Annual Meeting minutes be sent to all boards and members with emails, so they do not have to wait until next year to review the minutes. Council reported that the minutes are being reviewed and corrections will be made at the March meeting. The funeral procedures are being reviewed and will be updated since the church has been approved to hold funerals at St. Luke's.

New Business:

Lenten Worship Service: There will be service at 7PM on Ash Wednesday, 7PM service on Good Friday and 9AM service on Easter Sunday.

Meeting Highlight; from February 2022

The Endowment Trust Committee met on February 7, 2022. Minutes were reviewed and approved from the November 2021 meeting.

Financial: The Financial report for the period 01/01/2021-12/31/2021, prepared by Sherry Pippin was presented and approved.

New Business:

Committee: New committee members Lorna Meyer and Lisa Stuckmeyer were apprised of the current work of the Endowment Committee.

2022 Officers: Amanda Davis, Chairperson; Don Scherer, Secretary & Lorna Meyer, Treasurer

Fund Applications: The committee has received two applications for the available funds. The Board of Christian Education has submitted a request stating the funds would help with Sunday School curriculum and Vacation Bible School Supplies. The second application is from the Women's Guild wishing to purchase new yard, bridge, and road signs for the Chicken Dinner. These requests were voted upon, and motion was made, approved, and agreed by all.

Available Funds: Endowment has extended the deadline to apply if you are interested in the availability of funds. Any duly elected or appointed Board, Council or Church Committee (not individuals) are eligible to apply. The new deadline for application is April 30, 2022. Submitted applications will be reviewed at the May 2, 2022, Endowment Meeting. Applications are available upon request from the Church Office.

Highlights from February 2022

The Board of Elders met on February 7, 2022, at 6:30 p.m. Minutes were reviewed and approved from the January meeting.

Worship: Things continue to go well. Attendance has been steadily improving.

Ushers: Things are going well with three ushers per service. More volunteers are needed to usher.

Nursery Care: At this time, no nursery care is being provided. Discussed when we may consider again providing nursery care. For now, there does not seem to be a need, so we will leave it as is for now.

Funerals: Church Council approved to allow funerals to be held in the church. Masks are recommended but per our COVID guidelines, we are not requiring masks. Elders are working on updating the Funeral Committee procedures and volunteers to serve on the committee.

Birthday List: Brenda Day has updated the monthly birthday list through December 2022 and provided changes to Tricia

2022 Food Drive: The Food Drive will run from February 6th through March 13th. The food collected will be donated to the St. Joseph's Food Pantry. Collection will include dry goods, personal care items and baby care items. Monetary donations may be made also, and funds will be used to purchase additional items for donation.

Sausage Dinner: A sausage dinner is being planned by the combined Women's Guild and Evening Circle for Sunday, February 20th. The dinner will be drive through only 11am-4pm or until sold out. The cost is \$12/plate.

Membership Task Force: Responses from the inactive member list letter were reviewed and the task force will continue to move forward with recommendations to Council for those who should be moved to "Affiliate" status in the Church database.

Ash Wednesday: We plan to have an Ash Wednesday evening service at 7 p.m. on March 2nd. Good Friday evening service on April 15th at 7 p.m. and Easter Sunday service at 9 a.m. on April 17th.

Pastor: Pastor Josh is working to update the "Supply Pastor" list for us to use for those times when he is not available.

Highlight; from February 2022

The Board of Christian Education met on February 1, 2022, at 6:30 p.m. Minutes were reviewed and approved from the December meeting.

Sunday School: There were sixteen kids in attendance at reward party including Confirmands. This party included pizzas from Papa Murphy's, popcorn, treats, movie Encanto, and a puppet show by Chrissy's class Judd, Jillian, and Ella (Brenna and Delany assisted with sound effects).

Confirmation: Students are using the R4 curriculum which focuses more on spiritual experiences. Kids seem to be on track and are writing their Statements of Faith. No field trips have been scheduled but the BOCE is researching several options for virtual and/or live tours such as the Love Packages, Holocaust Museum, Greek Orthodox Church, and the Old Cathedral. More information to come.

Church Council: Rev. Pittman's contract has been renewed for one year with the option to review every three months. The 2022 BOCE Calendar has been approved.

2022 Budget: BOCE \$2500; VBS \$500. Connie applied for money from the Endowment Trust to help with purchases. Connie plans to keep a 2022 ledger of expenses.

Easter Breakfast: Adult Fellowship (no longer active) previously sponsored this event with help from the Confirmands and their parents. Connie will gather more information and more information to come.

Green Eggs & Ham Breakfast: Sunday, March 13th following worship. Kids encouraged to wear green and bring a friend for the day. The book will be read to the kids reiterating the positive message from the story. Committee assignments were finalized.

Palm Cross Making/Easter Egg Hunt: Saturday, April 9th. Confirmands will be asked to help with the Easter Egg Hunt and will need one volunteer to dress up in costume as our "special guest." We will also invite Pat/John Sieving to help instruct them on making Palm Crosses. Palms to be ordered, plastic eggs in Sunday School office. Discussion to finalize event at the next meeting.

Rummage Sale: Sale will take place on the church parking lot on June 4th (rain date June 11th). Sarah will make a signup sheet and flyer. This will be a fundraiser for BOCE with funds supporting the church youth. This will be advertised in the Leader free section and possibly the radio. Flyer will be emailed to local churches.

Halloween Activity: The activity originally planned for October 23rd has been changed to "Falling for Jesus Festival" which will include fall themed games, competitions and activities following Sunday School. Some ideas provided were shuffleboard, ping pong, cornhole, bobbing for donuts, corn kernel shucking. More discussion to follow. Kids will be encouraged to bring friends to worship, Sunday School, and the festival.

Event Sponsors: Connie spoke with Jess McLard regarding the proposal to have the Board of Elders sponsor the Bingo and Hayride/Bonfire for 2022. These events have been removed from the BOCE calendar.

Highlights from February 2022


