

<u>Building and Grounds Committee</u>: The security camera install has been completed. The dusk to dawn light is being replaced. The road was graded again. Suggestion to have a building "sponsor" for each building use because recently building light have been left on and the thermostat was left at 60 degrees in Fellowship Hall.

Endowment Committee: Meeting held August 2nd. Matt from UCF is attending the September 2nd meeting to speak with the group. Council has been invited to join the meeting.

<u>Search Committee</u>: First meeting held on Monday, August 2nd. Michelle Perry was elected Chairperson, Lisa Stuckmeyer Co-Chairperson and Jess McLard Secretary. They held a second meeting August 12th and another August 24th with Rev. Damien Lake in attendance. Don Dankel will be attending Council meetings to update on the Search Committee's progress.

<u>Funeral / Wedding Procedures</u>: Board of Elders requested to move funeral services back to funeral homes and not host any in the Sanctuary. We will continue to monitor the COVID situation when we need to for both funerals and luncheons. Tammy Glaus is the contact person for funeral luncheons. She will contact one of the three groups when necessary. At this time, no food is being prepared, volunteers are only serving. They are looking into having 2-3 options available to call and order food to be delivered.

<u>All Board Meeting</u>: There was an All-Board meeting on August 8th to discuss Bylaw revisions proposed by Board of Elders and Board of Christian Education. Both revisions were approved, and the Bylaws will be updated in the Church Office.

<u>Upcoming Events:</u> Women's Guild is planning the chicken dinner to be take out only this year and preorders due to the influx of food and paper products.

Highlight; from August 2021

Membership: It is the responsibility of the Elders to maintain the church membership roll with the approval of Church Council. At the August 8th congregational meeting it was approved to change Church Bylaw, Article 3 to better define the requirements for a member to be "in good and regular standing". This change was done to facilitate Elder's requirement to determine an accurate membership roll for the Church Search Committee to use in the church profile which defines who St. Luke's is and will greatly influence who we get as the next permanent pastor. It has been decided that our church roll is much larger than what it should be, is not accurate and needs to be reduced to a more realistic and accurate size. Elders has reached out to some other church members to help and formed a "Membership Task Force" that will take a first look at creating the proposed accurate membership roll. The task force Chairperson is Kay Moss. After a review by the Task Force, this "first cut" of a membership roll will be forwarded to the Board of Elders. Elders will take this "first cut" and closely coordinate with the Church Council Financial Secretary to establish a fair and accurate membership list and then submit to Church Council for approval. The plan is to have two lists. One list will be Church Members "in good and regular standing" and will be the official membership list. The second list is what formally was called "inactive members" and these individuals are who want to be associated with St. Luke's. This second list could be called "Friends of St. Luke's" or some other name, but the word "member" will not be used in the name of the list or attached to any individual names on the list but will allow individuals to be associated with St. Luke's. Hopefully this will do away with the terms "active member" and "inactive member". Per Rev. Lake, the UCC considers "active member" and "inactive member" as members when coming up with a church membership roll. This can sway the numbers for compensation.

Worship: Things continue to go well. Discussion regarding how to best capture attendance for those joining Worship Service on Sunday via ZOOM.

Confirmation Class: Will start new class on Sept 12th, Pastor Josh researching the program to use.

Baptism: Leighton Gillman was baptized on Sunday, August 22.

Funerals: At this time, it is preferred that all funeral services be held at a funeral home.

This year we have been blessed to make renovations and upgrades to the Church...here is a synopsis of the projects completed, underway and upcoming.


1) **Sanctuary lighting** Total Project Cost \$5318.66 Donation Total: \$5318.66 *WE DID IT! (Raised \$281.34 over costs, moved that money to HVAC fund per CC Mtg 8/16/21)*

2) **Sanctuary HVAC** Total Project Cost \$4400. Donations to Date: \$1231.34

3) Security System Total Project Cost \$2967.50 Donations to Date: \$0

4) **Road/Parking Lot** Total Project Cost \$13,634.83 Donations Total: \$10,000 *The remaining \$3634.83 will be paid from the B&G Expense Fund.*

A group of nine ladies met on August 5th at 11:00 a.m. for a special meeting regarding the Chicken Dinner. Four different companies had been contacted for information: Sysco, Kuna, Karsch's and Herrell's. At this time, the prices for the chicken could not be determined and the weight of the chickens would be 3 pounds or more. The price of the fry oil has quadrupled, and the paper prices has doubled or more. We hope to include beets, as they are a favorite of many (if we can purchase them sliced, not diced). Methods of taking orders and filling them were discussed. It was noted that there is only one person listed as a food service sanitization handler. There must be more, so we are requesting people to take the test. We also discussed Funeral Luncheon committees. Currently, they are only serving the families and guests. Tammy Glaus volunteered to be the contact person for the Pastor to notify if a luncheon is requested. She will determine which committee is the one that will be serving and notify them. More volunteers are always welcome.

Our next meeting will be September 2, at 11:30 a.m. The meeting focus will be the Chicken Dinner. We would invite all who have ideas, suggestions, or concerns to come join us. There will be discussion on Funeral Luncheons and committees also.

a family member or friend to join us on Sunday, November 7, 2021. You do not have to be a member of St. Luke's to be included in this Worship Service.

We would like to request that you submit a 3-4 sentence statement that will be read during service as well as a picture to be included in a slideshow of your lost loved one. These statements and pictures must be submitted to the Church Office by October 24th. This deadline provides time for us to prepare the slideshow, order flowers and prepare special memoriam for your loved one.

First Aid at St. Luke's AEDs

AED stands for Automatic Electronic Defibrillator and St. Luke's has two fully automatic AEDs. One is in the Narthex on the wall just to the right of the door leading into the "cry room" and the other is in Fellowship Hall on the wall on the right side of the door going to the hallway. Both are in white metal cabinets that have a window in the door so the AED can be plainly seen. Each AED has "Adult Pads" and "Child Pads" to use if a heart attack is suspected.

An AED is needed when someone's heart has stopped, which means they have gone into "full cardiac arrest" and their heart needs an electrical shock to get it going again. People can have a "heart attack" without being in "full cardiac arrest" and all they require is CPR without the electrical shock. The problem is it takes trained medical personal to know exactly what is going on. The AED's we have do that for you.

If it is suspected that someone is having a heart attack because they have passed out and they have no detectable pulse: (1) Begin CPR; (2) Have someone call 911; (3) Send someone to get the AED; (4) Apply the AED. The AED will first analyze them and give loud audible directions to you. The directions are something like, "no shock required, start CPR", or "shock required, stand by, don't touch the patient, shocking, continue CPR". While you continue CPR the AED is continually analyzing the patient and informing you of what to do. This cycle continues until first responders arrive.

St. Luke's purchased our first AED in 2011 and the second one a year or so later from Marelly, a local medical supplier and agent for Zoll Medical Corp. Each cost \$2,145 and thankfully we have never had to use them. The pads and the 10 batteries need to be changed every five years and sometimes a software upgrade is required. Marelly is good at letting us know when the pads are coming due for change or software is upgrade is needed. Marelly sends what we need, and Bob Schrepel has been maintaining the AED's.

St. Luke's also purchased a first aid kit and a first aid burn kit from Marelly who helps us keep them stocked when needed. Both kits are in the kitchen.

SUNDAY SCHOOL - 3RD QUARTER MISSION

The Sunday School 3rd Quarter Mission will run through September. Sunday School will be collecting for Brenden's Backpack.

Hunger can affect anyone, and hundreds of children in our area suffer every day. These can be children in your neighborhood, children that your child sits next to every day at school or children your child plays with at the park. These children do not look forward to the weekends and long school breaks because often they know that they may not have much to eat until they go back to school. School food programs only provide free breakfast and lunch during the week but many times these families struggle to put food on the table over the weekend.

Brenden's Friday Backpacks began in 2011 with 4 children in a single school and has grown to a program that currently feeds over 1400 children in 68 schools throughout Jefferson County and in St. Francois County on a weekly basis during the school year. Every Friday, each child takes home a bag of single-serve, non-perishable, kid-friendly foods that can be easily prepared and last until the child returns to school the next week. The program is run entirely by volunteers and takes anonymous referrals directly from local schools.

FESTIVAL OF SHARING

Women's Guild is collecting personal hygiene kits. There are plastic bags with the list of requested items placed in the Narthex for pickup. These bags will be collected both in the Narthex and Fellowship Hall. We ask that the items have lids tightened and placed into the large Ziploc bags provided. Thank you.
