

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

St. Luke's Friends & Family,

It seems in our larger culture, once we move past Halloween and similar Autumn festivals, our focus turns toward the Christmas celebration and the wonderful, special traditions which the end of our year brings. This can also be true in the life of the church and I confess the Advent and Christmas seasons are among my favorite, too. However, we do not want to move too quickly over the month, cheating the season out of its appropriate place and cheating ourselves out of what we may need to hear from God in this final month of the liturgical year.

One new opportunity will be my first weekly bible study, which will begin on Wednesday, November 15 at 11:00am. This study is called "Sing the Lord's Song" and we will examine the role of music within scripture, in both the Old & New Testaments. This will be a 6-week study and will wrap up on Wednesday, December 20. We will explore songs of hope & promise, victory & triumph, pain & anger, and glory & adoration. Want more information? You might never have been, but you are because the party wouldn't have been complete without you." I'm still learning names – and I apologize for my mistakes! – but I give thanks to God for each of you. St. Luke's would be incomplete without you. This month, as we gather for worship, let us give thanks together.
