## **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Dear St. Luke's Family and Friends,

Seventh century monk and bishop Isaac of Syria said, "Do not fall into despair because of your stumbling, for you should not consider them incurable. There is indeed a healer; he who on the cross asked for mercy on those who were crucifying him, who pardoned murderers as he hung on the cross. Christ came on behalf of sinners, to heal the brokenhearted and to bind up their wounds."

On a regular basis, I need to be reminded of this truth: God doesn't promise an easy life – and sometimes I make a mess of things. While God is at work moving our world toward what is just and right, we are going to experience how unfair our world can be, as well. And sometimes, my own decision-making gets me into a world of trouble! In 2 Corinthians, Paul observes how God's strength is no better revealed than in our weakness – but I'm not sure Paul was asking us to prove this point as often as we do.

Most important of all, God does promise we will never be left to face the reality of our choices or this unfair world alone. I am grateful for our church family, for all those lives God brings into my orbit, and for my God - come - near in Jesus Christ, who promises never to leave nor forsake us. We serve One who heals and calls forth life, who transforms our circumstances in ways we rarely see coming. On September 10<sup>th</sup>, I will begin a three-week sermon series which will wrestle with the question, "How do we live when life is unfair?" I hope to see everyone in worship on our September Sunday mornings.

We are one month into our journey together – and what a month it has been! I've enjoyed learning about traditions new to me, like our annual Rally Day, and I'm excited about the seasons we have in front of us. Sunday School, Choir, and Confirmation classes return this month, and on September 24<sup>th</sup> we have the privilege to celebrate and share in the baptism of Josie Belle Dulle. In addition, I continue to schedule appointments to meet each of our church households. Want to schedule a time?
