

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

September 4, 2024

Dear St. Luke's Family & Friends,

If you haven't noticed, we have hit the ground running on a new season here at St. Luke's. There is a lot of which you will want to take note in the days ahead. This coming Sunday, September 8, we will host our annual "Goodies with Grands" Sunday School kickoff following worship – if you are planning to attend, let us know right away. The following Sunday, September 15, will be our 2nd annual St. Luke's Fish Fry. You can find more information on this event in this very newsletter, but don't forget the change in time for worship; on September 15, we will worship at 10:00am and Sunday School and Confirmation classes will not meet that Sunday.

I hope you will be with us throughout the month of September as I share a sermon series called "Living a Life of Worth." This past Sunday I shared from the first chapter of the Epistle of James about each of us taking a hard look into our spiritual mirrors and being willing to ask, "What do I see?" Here is what is coming in the Sundays ahead:

September 8: "The Body of Christ," Ephesians :15-23 – Living a Life of Worth, pt. 2

September 15: "Everything," Mark 8:27-38 – Living a Life of Worth, pt. 3 September 22: "Real Life," James 2:1-17 – Living a Life of Worth, pt. 4

On the final Sunday of the September, I'll share a special sermon on the story of Esther. Don't forget – if you must miss a Sunday or cannot be with us in person, our services are available to both live stream and watch later on our St. Luke's YouTube channel.

Finally, on Thursday, September 12, I will begin my Fall mid-week Bible study on Jesus' parables, which I am calling "Gospel Parables." We will explore the background, setting, and message of each of these powerful stories as we consider what Jesus says to us even today. This study will meet for seven weeks on Thursday evenings via Zoom, ending on October 24. If you are interested in participating, let our office know so we can send you the necessary link. Not comfortable on Zoom alone? Find a partner and Zoom together!

I almost forgot to mention the September 21st all-church workday and the Festival of Sharing ministry, sponsored by our Women's Circle; information about each of these may be found on the pages ahead. Wow – there's quite a bit happening in the month of September, and before we know it, we will be at the Chicken Dinner, and then into our holiday schedule. Mark your calendars and let the church office know if you have any questions.
