## A Post-Easter Congregational Renewal Dream

"Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others."

Philippians 2:4

Jesus spent much of his ministry challenging his followers to move beyond their self-interests: "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." John 15:12. "Love your neighbor as yourself." Mark 12:31. He lived his challenge in his last days by washing the feet of his disciples after the Last Supper and dying on the cross and forgiving those who rejected him.

After Jesus' resurrection, the early church took that servant-hearted mindset to heart as they planted churches across the ancient world. In Acts 2, they addressed the needs of the community around them and in the spirit of Paul's challenge to the church in Philippi, they looked not to their own interests, but to the interests of others. The result of this outward focus was dramatic: And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved! Acts 2:47.

For the past year, First Lutheran's 13-member Dream Team has met monthly to chart a path that will lead to congregational renewal and growth. Following the outward focused example of the early church and the advice of Thom Rainer, an author and church consultant, they interviewed 14 community agencies and leaders to better understand the needs of our community as a way to determine how we as a congregation could better serve our community and help meet some of these needs.

As we bask now in the resurrection hope of another Easter, we are finally ready to announce the launch of five new community outreach initiatives that have grown out of our community conversations. As you read the descriptions on the next page, we invite you to get involved in whichever initiative best aligns with your life passion and gifts! We are praying that your involvement will not only be personally fulfilling but will also contribute to the renewal of the congregation! # **Renewal Volunteer Opportunities!**

#### The Open Door @ First Lutheran...Launching April 5

The Open Door is a small group mentoring / friendship / support for area high school students. Warren Dobry will be overseeing this program with the help of Doug Cruce. It will be open in our Fellowship Hall from 7:30 – 10pm every Tuesday and Thursday from April 5<sup>th</sup> through the end of school in May, with a plan to resume in the fall. Volunteers are needed to provide supervision and hang out with students. Snack volunteers are also needed. If you have a heart for high school students contact Warren.

#### Multi-Cultural Food & Music Fest / Block Party / Summer Tutoring

Our closest neighboring church is the Monmouth Chin Christian Church with over 250 members who fled the Chin Province of Myanmar (formerly Burma) because of religious persecution. Pastor Jeff initiated a conversation with their Pastor, Niceu Cinzah, last Easter, to extend a word of welcome, explore ways for our two churches to get acquainted, and to see if there were ways we could help them as they assimilate to life in a new country. The idea of FLC hosting a Sunday evening multi-cultural potluck in our fellowship hall followed by a music fest in our sanctuary is currently being explored by their pastor. Our hope is to host this event in May or June and invite our immediate neighbors to join us. Everyone will be invited to bring a favorite food from their culture to share at the potluck and then enjoy music from their worship band as well as our worship band and organ in the sanctuary. Since First Lutheran began as an immigrant church, it seems very fitting for us to reach out to these new immigrants as part of our 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration. *If you would like to* help plan this event, contact Kay Lovdahl, Jenny Sanberg, DeeDee Yez, or Patti Linman and then watch for further details. In addition, since the English as a Foreign Language program at Willits School is not offered in the summer, the possibility of offering a simple tutoring program for adults at FLC during the summer is also being explored. Curriculum and training would be provided by Kang Hee Hong, the EFL coordinator for the Regional office of Education. Contact Judy Sandberg to learn more about this volunteer opportunity.

#### **Alternative School Projects**

After meeting at Willits School with Jodi Scott, the Regional Office of Education Superintendent, and the ROE social worker, we learned of several wonderful servant opportunities at the Alternative School located almost in our backyard. The Alternative School serves 40 middle and senior high students from Warren, Henderson, and Mercer Counties who were not succeeding in their home schools. The following ministry opportunities were identified:

• Birthday and Graduation Cakes: Many of the kids at the Alternative School come from challenging home environments. Over 25% are legally considered homeless because they are sleeping on couches at friend's or relative's or their cars. We learned at a recent synod event that First Lutheran in Galesburg provides birthday and graduation cakes for every student at the Knox County Alternative School. The people at First, Galesburg love it and so do the students whose special days are often not celebrated. Jodi Scott loved the idea as well so we offered to begin providing cakes this spring, focusing initially on those students who will be graduating soon. If you like to bake and would like to get involved, contact Diane Carlson or Betty Bruyn.

- **Student Supply Needs:** We also learned that the students are often in need of personal hygiene items, clothing, food, and other things. The school staff tries to meet their needs, but their closets are often bare. We have asked them to provide us with an ongoing list of needs, so we can try to meet the need. Patti Linman will initially be coordinating this project. If you would to get involved, please contact Patti. Watch for a list of needed items soon.
- **Child Care Volunteers:** We also learned that the Alternative School also operates a child care center for kids from birth to three to serve the children of Alternative School students as well as the English as a Foreign Language program. They are always looking for volunteers to rock babies and play with the kids. Patti Linman will initially be coordinating this project as well. If you would to help out please contact Patti.

#### The Open Table...Community Conversation June 16-20 / Possible Fall Launch!

A nationally recognized faith-based program that addresses issues of poverty through the creation of safety nets of caring community members who make a commitment to help a family or individual overcome their life challenges with a goal toward becoming self-sufficient. Pastor Jeff's congregation in Florida was just getting involved in this ministry when he moved. The closest Open Table program is in nearby Carthage. Jon Katov, the founder of this ministry will be hanging out with us June 16-20 to introduce this ministry to the Warren County community with the hope of getting wide-spread church and community support for launching this ministry. #### FLC Preschool / Day Care Volunteer Needs

We have also decided to seek additional congregational volunteers for our own preschool / day care program. Patti Linman and Janice Algren will be providing occasional music this summer. Diane Carlson will take the lead in recruiting other volunteers to help with crafts, lead chapel time in the afternoon, play with the kids, or just provide an extra set of hands for the staff. ### Go in Peace, Serve the Lord, Thanks be to God

Every Sunday as we leave our worship, we leave to some variation of "Go in Peace, Serve the Lord, Thanks be to God." It is a sending of us out into the world as Christians surrounded by the Peace of God and sent into the world to serve God with thankful hearts.

It is not always easy to be sent -- because when we are sent, we are sent from something -- the safety of our gathering and our worship and our fellowship -- to something -- the chaos of the world. We are sent by a God of Peace who commands us to love one another, period. God places or offers no conditions on His love or on His command for us to love. It is a command to love without limits, without exception, without judgement. It is a command to love as we have been loved by God. It is a command to be God's peacemakers in the world. Go in Peace.

It is not always easy to serve -- because when we are sent to service, we are sent to service in the world. It is service not just in the comfortable places -- warm and dry and safe -- but it is service in the most uncomfortable and vulnerable places -- homeless shelters, food kitchens and pantries, hospitals, nursing homes, and prisons. God calls us to serve have-nots of this world, wherever they are found. It can be dirty, difficult and disorienting. It can take us from our comfort zone to a place where we are not comfortable. The command to serve is a command to bring God's love to those the world sees as unlovable.

It is not always easy to give thanks -- because even though we are sent out with grateful hearts, we can easily look at what we do not have. We want for earthly stuff. We think we do not have enough of this or that. We strive for more, yet the proclamation "Thanks be to God" reminds us that we have been given so much -- so much more than we will ever need. We have been blessed with family, a place to call home, a full stomach, dry clothes and people who look out for us. Our thankfulness comes from knowing that we are known by God.

You are blessed -- go and bless others.

#### Participant Directory Update...More Info Needed!

We are in the final stages of creating our new Participant Directory and need your help. We want to ensure that the information we include is accurate and complete. The spreadsheet we made available last fall for review was not reviewed by enough people for us to believe that our database is complete. With this in mind, we have created a new Household Data Form for every household to complete so we can correct our current data and add the names of non-member spouses as well as cell phone and email addresses for everyone in the household. We are also seeking both home addresses and mailing addresses, if they are different. This is designed to help us stay better connected and to help our new pastor get connected. #### TWO books worth reading.....

On November 11, 1984, engulfed in a dark tunnel of confusion, 18-year-old Andrew Chilstrom took his life. For Herb Chilstrom, his wife Corinne, and Andrew's siblings and friends, the world collapsed.

#### \* Andrew, You Died Too Soon by Corinne Chilstrom

In the most simple, straightforward language, this mother tells the heart's story: the love for her son which had to continue without that son; the embrace of speechless grief and of a murmuring, speaking community; the deep, spiritual events that occurred for her and her family when one son took his life.

It is the author's intent that reading this will be an experience which enhances life; one which will help make the encounter with grief not only more bearable, but actually growth-producing. Readers will find here therapy, catharsis, understanding, and even fresh grounding for faith, hope, and love – hope, being at such times and momentarily, "the greatest of these." #### \* When a Father Loses a Son by Herbert W. Chilstrom

In When a Father Loses a Son, Chilstrom opens his heart, gathers together the essence of his journey and offers it to others. Though his aim is to help fathers – especially with the loss of a child – parents, siblings or friends will find this book helpful. (From the book's order form.)


