Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from our God, Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifier. I write these words to you with a changed heart. When I started this "short-term part-time interim" in November of 2015, I thought I would be leaving you much sooner. But God had other plans.

I have watched First Lutheran open up and become a more inviting place to Monmouth and beyond. I have seen old relationships within the community strengthened, and I have watched the Dream Team and the gifts of Pastor Jeff create new and unique opportunities for ministry in this congregation, in Monmouth and beyond.

Throughout this time, I have tried to live the advice that I was given by a treasured Seminary Professor – love your congregation. I have accepted your love and I have tried to listen to your past, your pain, your hopes and your dreams.

As I say goodbye, I lift up again the themes that I believe sustain and support First Lutheran as children of God. These themes, when lived in action – remember Christian is a verb – will sustain and grow this ministry. First, love one another – no exceptions. Second – live Matthew 25 – feed and clothe and shelter and visit without judgement. Never judge those who you help for you may be there someday. And finally, work for justice for all of the people of God including the least of these.

And my advice to you about your new Pastor and family – be open, be patient, care for them, love them and pray for them.

And I am also trusting the witness of the Apostle Paul in Philippians 1:6 "that the one who began a good work among (us) will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ!"

My memories of my time at First tend to be bittersweet: the bitter involve burying so many good people whom I had come to be fond of, to respect, whose life stories could be fascinating and often moving, and whose opinions and advice I valued. Shortly before I retired I went through the church records and found that of the many funerals I conducted, fifty or more were for active and regularly-attending members; that's a lot of vacant seats on Sundays. An honor, to be sure, but a sad one, was also to lay to rest two great colleagues, Pastors Youngquist and Olsen, whom I treasured as friends and deeply respected as Churchmen.

But there are sweet memories as well. I came to First convinced that congregations could not just continue the 'same-old, same-old,' always thinking in terms of "us," but had to become open, welcoming—and actively inviting others into the fellowship of the Gospel. I encouraged replacing the church sign facing the wrong way on a one-way street with an illuminated message-sign, as well as adding directional signs inside the church so that outsiders might feel less 'lost' It took two tries, but we put a handicapped-accessible restroom in the narthex so that those with disabilities could feel more comfortable here. I encouraged installation of illuminated exit signs and emergency lighting to make our building a safer place—and radon-abatement to make it and the pre-school a healthier place. These were accomplishments to celebrate.

My fondest memories, though, are of the children: sitting on the front row for a children's message—and stopping on the way back to their seats to ask a question (sending me fumbling for my microphone switch, not knowing what was going to be asked). And the final few years of confirmation classes were by far my most enjoyable ones in 39+ years of ministry, with active give-and-take and free-form discussions. And, of course, those trips into Chicago, giving our younger folk a taste of the immensity, excitement, and rich resources of that marvelous city ... and we always came back with just as many as we left with.

And of course, many good-hearted and faithful people, whose dedication to their Lord, interest in learning and willingness to be in loving service to others—these, too, are among the sweet memories of First Lutheran.
