## For everything there is a season, a time for every matter under heaven.

Ecclesiastes 3:1

Cue The Byrds singing their famous Turn, Turn, Turn oldies hit based on this timehonored passage in Ecclesiastes. Here the ancient writer reminds us there is a time for everything:

a time to be born, and a time to die; time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; time to mourn, and a time to dance; a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; time to keep, and a time to throw away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; time for war, and a time for peace.

The modern writer would include: there is a time for summer break and a time for school to resume its lessons. And that time is called August.

August is that transition month for our community. Parents and Grandparents get ready to send the kids back. Teachers prepare classrooms and new lessons and are ready to welcome back the students. Students long for more summer break, yet yearn for what school will bring this year.

In the church, we too are transitioning from quieter summer months back into fall routines and monthly ministry happenings. Are you ready to jump back into the Prime Beef Festival? Or for the Oyster Soup Dinner, or helping with parking lot flyers or welcoming students to a grilled hot dog lunch? Are you ready for the Word of God on Sunday mornings to revitalize your soul and compel you into the work of discipleship?

Sometimes our readiness doesn't matter. The calendar flips its page whether we like it or not. It still feels like yesterday when winter was forcing school to cancel because of ice, snow and extreme cold. It feels like just last night when we were dealing with the spring floods and the worries of getting our crops into the ground. And now school is back. Where did the time go? Are we really ready for what comes next? It doesn't matter where it went or if we are ready. The time is now.

## **CONCERNS ABOUT SUICIDE**

In light of recent events, Pastor Jamie asked if I would write for the Newsletter about suicide. In thinking about what to write, one thing that came to my mind is something I have heard time and time again when a child or teen has either mentioned suicide or attempted suicide. Some adults minimize its importance or value by saying "they just did it for attention". My response has been twofold. First, if it takes the person doing that to get attention, something is wrong. Second, what if it had worked? That attention seeking statement is often made if the attempt does not seem to have been lethal. What matters, though, is whether the person making the attempt thought it was lethal. For example, did the 10-year-old think four aspirin would kill him? If yes, that made the "gesture" a serious attempt. (Yes, young children think about and attempt suicide. In the past year, I have talked with a 10-year-old about suicide. This is not the first 10-year-old or younger student that I have worked with on that issue.)

Our society minimizes mental health and addiction issues far too much. Maybe it is because for too many generations we have hidden secrets in our families, whether it is our Uncle Cullie having been "away for a while" - which is secret-speak for him having been in a sanitarium or psychiatric unit or Grandpa John who, "well you know, he just likes his beer/drink a little too much". So, of course, we do not take it seriously when we hear statements or see certain behaviors that may be related to a person being very seriously depressed and suicidal.

These are the types of things that we do need to pay attention to:

- -- Has the person been more depressed/down/moody?
- -- Has a person become more withdrawn from their family or friends?
- --Have they shown a change/decrease in appetite?
- --Have they been showing a decrease in interest in people/events/activity/ hobbies that they used to enjoy?
- --Have they been making comments reflecting thoughts or feelings of hopeless/ helpless/worthless?
- -- Have they begun using or increased the use of alcohol/other drugs?

What do you need to do if you hear/see these signs, especially if there are multiple ones and/or they are intensifying?

- --- ASK them if they have been thinking about suicide or wishing they were dead. NO, you will not put the idea of suicide in their heads if they have not already been thinking it. What it will demonstrate is that somebody cares about them and is willing to bring up a very serious topic to them and ask about how they are thinking and feeling and has noticed them and the changes in their life.
- --- LISTEN to them--encourage them to talk about their thoughts and feelings. Express empathy for the distress that they are feeling, concern for their well-being, and willingness to help them. Encourage them to get help quickly. Stay with the person until the two of you have put a plan together to keep them safe like staying with someone or getting help from a professional. You may have to take them to a counselor, emergency department, or doctor's appointment.

# Lake Warren Potluck Breakfast & Worship – August 11<sup>th</sup>

The annual Lake Warren worship service will be held Sunday, August 11<sup>th</sup> at 10 AM. Worship will be preceded by a potluck breakfast starting at 9 AM. ### **Parking Lot Flyer Ministry**

# SCHOOL KITS

#### SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- If you are looking to purchase backpacks, the preferred style is often used in the U.S. for youth to carry athletic equipment. Try your local sporting goods store or search online using the keywords, "buy drawstring backpacks."
- Before purchasing backpacks, make sure they meet the size requirements (14" x17") and guidelines below. You can download a list from our website of suppliers who have appropriate bags available for purchase in bulk.
- You can also make bags for the kits. <u>A pattern is available</u> from our website.
- · Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- . Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- . Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

#### INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH SCHOOL KIT

FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ "; no loose leaf paper
<b>ONE</b> 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
ONE pencil sharpener
<b>ONE</b> pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
<b>FIVE</b> unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
<b>FIVE</b> black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons
ONE 2 1/2" eraser
<b>ONE</b> sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

#### HOW TO PACK YOUR KITS OF CARE

- Place ruler between notebooks. Place all items neatly into the bag and draw the drawstring together.
- Pack completed kits, like items together, in boxes.
   Label contents in LARGE, BLOCK LETTERS on the outside of the boxes.
- Use strong cartons secured with packing tape, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- · Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.
- Include the name and address of your group or congregation on each box and label the contents


