

¹⁹And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people." ²⁰Immediately they left their nets and followed him.

Matthew 4:19-20

With the newest Star Wars movie out, and it setting its box-office records and completing the saga of the Skywalker family from a galaxy far, far away, I can't help but remember a line from the very first Star Wars movie released, the one now called Episode 4, A New Hope. In that movie, our hero Luke is rescued in the desert by the man who would become his mentor. And while they are first meeting, Obi-Wan offers a gift to Luke, and says:

"I have something here for you. Your father wanted you to have this when you were old enough, but your uncle wouldn't allow it. He feared you might follow old Obi-Wan on some [dang] fool idealistic crusade like your father did."

At this moment, in the Star Wars saga, Luke has no intention of following Obi-Wan anywhere, he realizes he has to get home to his Uncle and Aunt, or else he will be in trouble. When he does return home, he discovers they have been killed by the Empire, and Luke's future is sealed. He will follow Obi-Wan and become his disciple.

On the big screen, it takes some powerful storytelling, and George Lucas showing his family a grand picture of what life on this remote planet was like, and how circumstances force Luke into choosing to follow Obi-Wan.

In the Gospel of Matthew, our author simply says, "Jesus said, 'follow me' and they did.' End of story. No big picture. We don't see any conflict between these fishermen and the empire around them. There is no backstory to Simon and Andrew, James and John. There is no parental warning "Don't follow that rabbi, he's a fool." There is no incursion of the Roman Empire storming into Capernaum, giving rising tension to whether these four men will choose to follow the new hero, or stay loyal to the ways of the Empire to avoid being the next victim.

Our Church

There is simply a calling. There is simply a response. And whatever the backstory is for the four men named in Matthew chapter 4, it is left for us to fill it in. It is up to us to ask the right question, too. We don't need to ask why these 4 men followed Jesus. We need to ask why do we follow Jesus? Is Jesus just another foolish trend, that is maybe less foolish than any other passing fancy we could spend our time following? Or is Jesus really a Rabbi, a teacher, who will show us the way to live our life, who will teach us to fish for people?

Why do you follow Jesus? That is the question this story begs us to ask. Maybe once upon a time it was because our parents brought us to Jesus, our parents didn't discourage us from following Jesus, our parents taught us the ways of faith. But maybe it is more than that. In this season of Epiphany, the question of discipleship and why we follow Jesus will be raised by our scripture readings. And we may wonder why Simon, Andrew, James and John as well as the other 8 of the original 12 male disciples followed Jesus. But we know why we do. Let your story be the bait, placed on the end of the line that you cast out as you fish for people.


