So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them... Genesis 1:27

There is an interesting tenet of faith hidden right in the very opening verses of our scripture. The tenet is that God created all humankind. This tenet is tucked in between God doing all sorts of other acts of creation and God resting on the seventh day. It is hidden on the sixth day of creation according the poetry of Genesis chapter one, and yet within that poem more is said about God's creation of humankind than all the other acts of creation. God creates humankind in God's image, God creates humankind with gender identity, God blesses humankind with a special gift of dominion over everything else that was created.

This is a fascinating tenet because it tells us God created all people. God did not create some people and not others. There were not multiple gods who each created their own peoples. Nope, our scripture says the One and only God created all humankind, all in the image of God.

This is fascinating in that we can at a certain level recognize the truth that we have just one God in this universe, and we can and often do give thanks for God's wonderful act of creation, including the creation of people. But it is fascinating in that we often do not actually live as though we believe this tenet of faith.

If we lived according to the tenet that One God, the only God, the God known to us today as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, created all people then the following would be true:

There would be no one who is called "illegal." There would be no one who is called "alien." There would be no reason to divide humanity for purposes of power, or privilege, or dominance. There would be no discrimination by race or creed or gender identity or sexual orientation.

But sadly, in our world we do have people who are called "illegal" and "alien"; we do have people who are divided by power and privilege; we do have people who are oppressed by discrimination. Often the very same people who profess faith in the One God, the only

God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, who created all people, are the same people who accept the status quo of human division.

Just as often, there are people who profess the tenet of faith that God did not just create the Hebrew peoples. God did not just create western society. God did not just create Caucasians. God created ALL people. These people recognize that this tenet is not simply hidden in the opening verses of Genesis but is echoed throughout both the Old and New Testaments.

How do we count ourselves among the people of faith who live this tenet in practice and not just by words? It begins by believing that walking in front of every person is a messenger of God who is boldly proclaiming: "This is the Image of God".

The refugee child separated from her parents and held in a detention center has a messenger of God standing in front of her boldly proclaiming "This is the Image of God".

The son being kicked out of his parents house for daring to declare he is gay has a messenger of God standing in front of him boldly proclaiming, "This is the Image of God."

The homeless vet, the drug-addicted newborn, the co-worker being fired for being transgendered, the hungry student at school who gets mocked for not having enough for school lunch, the black man being harassed for sweeping the sidewalk in front of his apartment, they all have a messenger of God standing in front of them boldly proclaiming, "This is the Image of God."

And so, too, do you. Standing in front of you is a messenger of God boldly proclaiming, "This is the Image of God."

Let's use this summer to practice seeing the messenger of God standing before us, bolding proclaiming "This is the Image of God." The more we practice seeing the messenger before us, the more we will be able to see the messenger standing in front of every person, every created and blessed child of God, each with his or her own messenger standing before him or her, boldly proclaiming, "This is the Image of God."

THE KEY CARD DOOR ENTRY SYSTEM

The key card door entry system that was installed for the new security system is finally ready to activate, with a planned start date of Thursday, July 18th. There were a few delays while we waited out some technical issues. Those issues have now been resolved. Key cards for members are available in the office. Key cards for the preschool parents will be available from the preschool starting Monday, July 15th.

A key card is a small credit card sized gadget that when placed in front of the small black device on the education building entrances off the parking lot and off of South B Street will open the lock and allow you to enter the door. The key card for members will have access privileges from 7:30am to 10pm, Monday-Friday. It should be noted that for worship services and evening events the doors will be unlocked; you will not need a key card for entry during those times.

If you come to the door off the parking lot and do not have a key card, there is a bell-shaped icon on a touchscreen. Upon touching the icon, you will hear a buzz, and both the office and the preschool will be notified that someone is at the door. Wait a few seconds, then try the door. (The click of the door unlocking is rather quiet.) If no one answers, someone may have stepped away from a desk or no one may be in the office.

While drop by visits are always welcome, it is safest to call ahead to the church office to make sure someone will be in the office when you want to come by. Remember, Courtney's regular office hours are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, 8am to 1pm. Pastor Jamie's regular office hours vary, though generally you can find him in his office during the mornings, even on Wednesdays.

As with any change, we know there will be some getting used to this new system. The regular keys to the education building will still work, and can always be used for access. If you have one of these keys, you would not need a key card. If you want a key card, stop by the office and talk with Courtney. A limited number have been paid for by an anonymous donation.

Thank you for your patience as we discussed, chose our option, and waited for all of the technical issues to be resolved. Once this is running smoothly, we will be thankful that our preschool and daycare will be in line with modern safety standards.

The students at RAES (the Alternative School) are always very appreciative of the items brought in from our church. We will be putting the containers back out once school starts up again, and will let you know of any special needs.




