In the refrain the answer comes in the form of a picture: "Baby don't hurt me, don't hurt me no more." What is love? He asks. He answers, it is when we are not being hurt by the one who loves us.

God's love is also found in the self-sacrificial love of our Savior going to the cross, showing us how to die to live for others.
