#### John Chapter 15

John comes across rather repetitive throughout these discourses by Jesus. The metaphor changes, this chapter Jesus says "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower." Also, Jesus says, "I am the vine, you are the branches." These metaphors lead into Jesus again talking about the commandment to love, the difference between the world and God's Kingdom, and the Holy Spirit coming to lead us in belief and testimony for Jesus. Some scholars wonder if these discourses were really from other times in Jesus life, and the author collected them here for the ease of story telling. Other scholars understand that in ancient Greek rhetorical writing took this format. It was not considered repetitive, but accentuating the point, driving home the theme so the hearer would have a more complete picture.
