Luke Chapter 11

In most confirmation classes, we would have spent a lot of time on Jesus' teaching about prayer, and instructing us with the words we now know as the Lord's Prayer. We probably did not spend as much time on all those to whom Jesus said, "Woe." The word Woe has an origin as an exclamation of lament. Jesus is greatly saddened by those who would rather hold onto power, and corrupt ways, than experience the newness of life offered by the Gospel. Jesus laments that these will not receive his message of newness. Jesus laments the pharisees and lawyers who burden others with strict rules while finding solace in how the rules benefit them. And Jesus knows that if you want to stay in your power-hungry, corrupt ways, you will always try to outwit the Gospel, but the Gospel is never outwitted.
