<u>Today's Reading</u>

Matthew Chapter 13

Chapter 13 is a chapter of parables. Jesus explains why he speaks in parables, but his explanation isn't very clear. Apparently an ancient prophet, possibly Isaiah, used parables and explained his use of parables in a similar manner. In short, a parable is a brief story. It is a metaphor or a simile. It compares what cannot be known to what can be known. Jesus is trying to help his disciples understand more about the Kingdom of God, something very unknowable. The images he uses are common, every day experiences for his people. Parables are not always one-to-one comparisons, though. Sometimes cynicism, irony, reverse psychology, and other techniques are used. So reading parables take time to understand. So, if you are confused by any of these, do not worry—you are in good company.

What might be a modern common, everyday experience you would use to compare the Kingdom of God with? How might you tell that comparison in a two or three sentence short story?
