Scout Sunday

Scout Sunday is a day typically held in February near the anniversary of the founding of the Boy Scouts of America. A Chicago publisher named W.D. Boyce traveled to England in 1909 and when he was lost in a fog, a scout came along and helped him. Earlier in 1907 Lord Baden-Powell had founded a Scout program in London. Boyce met with leaders of the London scout program and brought the concept home with him.

On February 8, 1910, Boyce officially launched the Boy Scouts of America. The program has gone through a few changes over the first 114 years. To-day there are Cub Scouts for ages Kindergarten to 5th grade, open to boys and girls. Scouts BSA is what used to simply be called Boy Scouts, but today is a program for youth (boys and girls) ages 11 to 17. There is a Venturing program for older youth that focuses on connecting with a career field like a police or fire department.

Weekly Devotional

"Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on hte road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?" - Luke 24:32

When you think of shared ministry, there are probably a few images that come to mind. You probably first think about a congregation that is too small to afford its own pastor, so a neighboring church has to share. You probably imagine a pastor who is torn between two places, and two congregations not getting the full attention of their pastor. These myths about shared ministry persist, even as we have very positive examples of shared ministry right here in our midst.

For example, did you know we share ministry with our neighbor churches in town for the annual VBS? Or that we work together with congregations across Monmouth to support ministries at Jamieson Center, Strom Center, and the Recharge Teen Center? Did you know we shared confirmation ministry with Faith Lutheran in Wataga, two pastors working together to lead 5 youth and their families into a deeper relationship with the Lord? Do you know we are in a shared ministry called Synod, with 120 other congregations across northern Illinois, accomplishing ministry in powerful ways that we could not ever dream of accomplishing alone? These are just some examples of shared ministry that already happen in our daily ministry.

Shared Ministry also can mean two or more congregations partnering in mission more directly with sharing pastoral or other office staff. In these situations, the congregations in the partnership are not receiving a part-time pastor, nor are they paying for a part-time pastor, nor is this ministry near closing, nor are they close to merging out of existence. In Shared Ministry, or Cooperative Ministry, or an older term "Parish" Ministry, each congregation is receiving a full time pastor, is a full time ministry site, and provides ministry in ways that may not have been able to happen if they remained alone.

Shared Ministry is something to be explored in the near future for First Lutheran Church. Even as we have recently named a new mission statement, and are seeking to build our congregation with that mission, we may have to consider what strengths can come from sharing ministry in a new way with a neighboring congregation. This discernment is only at the beginning, and is far from being realized. But we begin with alleviating fears, we begin with hopeful and yet unexplored opportunities before us. And we begin renewed in a shared call from Jesus to love our God and love our neighbor, a call that we all share in the waters of baptism.
