Vision and Purpose Giving Update



Throughout December, our congregation will support the Recharge Teen Center here in Monmouth.

Located on South Main Street, the teen center is open weekdays from 3 PM to 6 PM. It provides a place for high school teens to hang out, develop life skills, and for those in need, to receive a warm meal, have laundry services, select from donated clothing items, and more.

Our endowment committee donated \$500 which Pastor Jamie was able to present to the center already. Now this month, our congregation has an opportunity to match what the endowment committee did. Mary, did you know that your baby boy would one day walk on water?

Opening line for the song, "Mary, Did You Know"

The popular song "Mary, Did You Know" is a favorite Christmas song for many. For others, it is a source of controversy. The lyrics of the song ask a series of questions, essentially pondering what Mary did or did not know about her baby boy. The song seems to be written as if Mary has already given birth and is holding her newborn son and is pondering herself what all this means. At its best, the song is a beautiful lullaby that can only be sung in hindsight knowing the full story of Jesus. At its worst, the song is accused of suggesting Mary had no idea what she was getting into with this baby she was told to name Jesus.

So, what did the Angel say to Mary? The story only appears in Luke's Gospel. In chapter 1, the Angel greets Mary and tells her "[Jesus] will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." The angel also goes on to say, "the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God."

What the angel Gabriel says to Mary is kind of vague on one hand, but also very specific on the other. Mary would have been familiar with ancient prophecies in Isaiah, for instance, that spoke of a coming messiah. There would have been a tremendous fervor about a messiah during the time of Herod's reign because of the way the Roman Empire treated Israel and the way the government of Israel was so corrupt. There would have been tremendous stories told of a powerful king being raised up who would conquer enemies, vanquish foreign militaries, and restore glory to Jerusa-lem and all of Israel. And yet the story of Jesus as it unfolds in Luke's Gospels, and really across all the Gospels, is quite different. Jesus walks on water, the blind see, the deaf hear, the dead live again, the lame leap, the dumb speak praises of the Lamb. And there – that last word of that sentence— "The Lamb" — this metaphor, more than anything Mary might have known as a young woman recently betrothed and yet never having slept intimately with Joseph, becomes the overarching narrative to who Jesus is. And this is so very different and yet it can be subtly found in what Gabriel says just as much as the expected war-horse riding King could be found in what Gabriel said to Mary.

So, what did Mary know when Gabriel came and opened the way for her to be included in God's salvation story? It is a wonderful thing to ponder, a beautiful thing indeed, and the only way I can identify in anyway with Mary is sitting now with a 21 year old graduating from college next spring—Jamie, did you know your baby girl would one day lead the Marching Band, Jamie did you know, that one day she would play many instruments and sing like an angel? I think every parent can profoundly relate to this Christmas song and appreciate the wonder and mystery of maybe knowing some things but also not having a clue what this newborn child will gift the world with.
