Ash Wednesday

Pastor Jamie will be mailing to members a black swatch of cloth for everyone to pin onto their clothing on Ash Wednesday. This will take the place of our traditional ashes.

The black cloth will represent the ashes and sack cloth that is symbolic of grieving and repentance. Throughout the Old Testament kings, prophets, and sometimes even the whole people of the nation, rip their clothing, wear sackcloth, or cover their faces with ashes. These signs are an attempt to get God to change plans of destruction or punishment, and to restore the people to right living.

Today, we wear the ashes to remember our own mortality and that Christ has redeemed us, drawing us into an everlasting life.

"They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; ... and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

Revelation 7:16-17

In the book of Revelation, God casts a vision of what life will look like in the Kingdom of God, when Christ rules as the Lamb of God at the center. This vision is often interpreted as a future event, one we can look forward to when the resurrection happens and the final trumpet blast sounds. But the author of Revelation intended for us to see this vision as a present reality, one with the faithful can make happen. One piece of this vision if here in chapter 7, a vision of the end of hunger and thirst.

Globally 610 million people face chronic hunger, that means the do not have secure meals. These people do not know where their next meal will come from. And when they do find a meal, it does not have enough nutritional value to sustain their health. If we treat the Revelation vision as only a future event, then ignoring the plight of our hungry neighbors is easy. If we treat the Revelation vision as a present day happening that we are called to partner with Christ to make real, then the plight of our hungry neighbors is a call to action.

This Lent, we will hear that call to action. We will discuss the global hunger crisis and ways we as a congregation can actively work toward a day when they will hunger no more. Some actions are easy. Donating to the ELCA World Hunger Appeal, supporting other agencies that work toward ending world hunger, or even donating to our local Jamieson Center, which provides a food pantry and meal assistance program, or to Strom Center, which also provides a meal assistance program. We will explore these easy ways we can contribute to the vision of Revelation, as well as let the Spirit move through us as we consider additional ways our congregation can go beyond just the easy donating of money to solve world hunger. What will the Spirit call us to do? Join us this Lent and be part of the conversation discovering that answer. In Peace, Pastor Jamie
