The Bible Study will introduce us to our Bible and using a series of videos from the YouTube Channel "The Bible Project" we will become more familiar with what is in the Bible and how it came to us.

This week, we will have a story from the Bible about a young man named Eutychus. Eutychus was attending a worship service being led by Paul. Paul was preaching long into the night, and Eutychus was sitting on the window sill, fell asleep and fell out of the window, dying when he hit the ground—three floors below. Paul dismissed his death quickly, and the young man got up, but Paul seemed to ignore him and resumed preaching as the young man was taken home to continue recovering.

What a strange story. Why is it in our Bible? Why does Paul dismiss the miracle of the young man's return to life? Why does the rest of worship just go on as if nothing happened? What could this possibly tell us about being the people of God?

Join us on Sunday to read the complete story (Acts 20:7-12) and learn more about it.

The Bible study will not be held on Feb 4, but will resume on Feb 11.

And when we hear these stories, we are to hear Jesus say those same words to us, "Follow me." Yes, to us, ordinary people, who are not all successful, who are not all good at morals, who are not all religious scholars, who have problems with family, friends, neighbors, and even God. Yes ... Jesus says to you and to me, "Follow me." We don't know why, but Jesus does know and still he calls us.

Jesus answered [Nathanael], "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these."

John 1:50

In the story when Jesus calls Nathanael to follow him, there is an interesting exchange which we are not given the full details of. Jesus tells Nathanael that he saw him under a fig tree. What was Nathanael doing under the fig tree? We do not know. The gospel writer, John, does not tell us that. But it was apparently something that Nathanael did not expect for anyone, let alone Jesus, to have seen him. Yet Jesus saw him. Jesus connected with Nathanael over what was seen. And Nathanael recognized that only Jesus, the Messiah, the anointed of God, could truly see and know him.

Jesus sees you, just as Jesus saw Nathanael. Now on one hand, this could sound creepy, like, Jesus sees us when we are doing something morally questionable, or have a thought in our head that isn't the most pure, or even (gross) picking our noses! Well, this is not what it means to be seen by Jesus. Jesus is not some super spy for God who is watching us to see when we mess up and counting up the times we did it right.

To say that Jesus sees us is to say that Jesus truly knows who we are, our whole self, our brokenness, our short-comings, our deepest yearnings, our fears, our successes, our hopes, and all that makes us who we are. In the TV Series, The Chosen, the character Nathanael is depicted as an architect who has a project fail due to a manager not giving him the proper supplies, yet Nathanael is blamed for the failure. He ends up under a tree alone, he is crying out to God who he feel is silently ignoring him. Jesus was no where near that moment when Nathanael was under the tree. Yet because Jesus is God's Son, Jesus did see Nathanael crying out to God in a moment of great depression.

And Jesus sees us just as Jesus sees Nathanael. Nathanael needed to know God loved him and that God valued him, even when the world was crashing around him. We need to know God loves us and that God values us. Some days the world is crashing around us. Some days we are not getting it right. Some days we are coming up short. Some days we are fighting with family or neighbors. Jesus isn't spying ready to pounce on us for what is "sin" or what is life crashing around us. Jesus sees us and is ready to tell us we are loved by God, we are valued by God, and Jesus calls us to follow him, just as he called Nathanael.

Because once we fully understand that we are loved by God and valued by God, we will be ready to see even greater things as we follow Jesus in the way of mercy, compassion, forgiveness, and love towards everyone.
