Dear Friends and Family,

So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day.

2 Corinthians 4:16

If there has ever been a time to lose heart, a pandemic that is stretching into its 16 month may be that time. We have rehashed time and time again what has been lost. We have grieved experiences that will never come again. We have lamented that normal routines have been disrupted. And now, our long period of lamenting and grieving and rehashing is nearing its end. We anticipate soon that Illinois will remove all remaining barriers to gathering and being together in public spaces. We anticipate there will be a lot of rejoicing. We anticipate there will be some very slow adapting back to a new sense of normal.

But if this era has been a season of losing heart, faith in Christ Jesus is all the more reason we have clung to a hope that has kept us upbeat and positive throughout this year-plus era. While we may have felt outwardly wasting away, Jesus Christ has been renewing us internally. What have we been internally renewed for?

Well, for starters we have been renewed with a sense of creative and flexibility. We do not suffer when we learn new ways of worshipping and lifting up our praise. We did not fall off the proverbial edge of the world as we gathered by Zoom to study God's Word.

We have also been renewed for our sense of gathering. Gathering as an obligation is long gone. Now gathering is an intentional choice. We are not going simply because it is habit. We are going to worship because God has carried us through this era and we are excited to celebrate the mysteries of our great God.

We have also been renewed for ministries, some old, some new, some old being done in new ways. We are renewed for bringing grace, forgiveness, and mercy—all that we first experience from God—to our neighbors, both here in Monmouth and Warren County and beyond. So we do not lose heart, Paul says, because Jesus Christ used this time of outward wasting to renew our very inner nature, and with the newness we have been given, Jesus now sets us free to proclaim this same gift to all the world.
