I briefly shared in a recent email that I was going to have an MRI. I have been dealing with a right shoulder injury that has taken me a while to figure out. As most motions, I am quite normal. Then I twist my arm a certain way, and boy does that pain hit ... sometimes subtly, sometimes quite harshly. You probably won't ever notice me in pain, unless I try to put my arms behind my back, as I do sometimes in worship—at least until the pain reminds me I can't do that. Anyway, the MRI indicated that I have some torn cartilage, something called a Labrum. I am waiting to see a surgeon to figure out what happens next. And what happens next may not be for a while. But if you read me saying something about that MRI in a previous e-mail or overheard me talking about it with someone, this is what it is about. Nothing too serious. Just a crazy injury that happened for some random reason that I can't explain.

Jesus said to [Mary Magdalene] "Do not hold onto me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." John 20:17

Have you ever noticed that throughout the Easter season, which is 7 weeks long, we have very few stories of the Risen Jesus? Of the four Gospels, Mark has no resurrection appearances at all; Matthew has just one; Luke adds a road trip with Jesus to Emmaus; John has Jesus appear to Mary Magdalene at the empty tomb, then to the disciples three times. That's it. Those are all the stories. Yes, it begins with the discovery that the tomb is empty; and, yes, each Gospel has an announcement from an angelic figure proclaiming Jesus is risen, then each Gospel really does not dwell on that, they all end in an abrupt manner. One reason for this dramatic shift is the Gospel writers are telling us the work of Jesus continues through the work of the Church. We experience the Risen Jesus now in road trips, worship, opening scripture, sharing meals, and doing the very things that Jesus did. So, Mark and Matthew have an emphasis on returning to Galilee, the place where Jesus' ministry began. Luke emphasizes remaining in Jerusalem for the coming Holy Spirit, the experience we mark as Pentecost Sunday, as the sign to go out from Jerusalem to the ends of the earth. John moves the story away from actual proofs that Jesus is risen to a simple command, "Feed my sheep", continuing a theological motif throughout John's Gospel and his three letters that faith in Jesus is demonstrated in love for others.

So the resurrection appearance to Mary Magdalene, which only appears in John's Gospel, is the clue to unravel this mysterious way all the gospels end. "Do not hold onto me," Jesus says. If we stay at the tomb, if we stay holding onto a physical Jesus, then we cannot go and do what we are supposed to be doing. We have to let the physical Jesus go, the Jesus who was Crucified and is Risen has to be also Ascended so that we can go about our work. There may be a bit of a metaphor here that connects to our season of high school and college graduates. These students are finishing their courses of study and in order to go on into their field, they have to leave their professors and academic advisors behind and go into their field of work and do all they have been trained for. So it is for us as Jesus' disciples. We have completed another cycle of stories with the presence of Jesus—his birth narrative at Christmas welcomed Jesus to the world; now his Passion narrative tells us his physical presence is no longer here, rather how we experience Jesus today is in the church, its many and various ministries, the sacraments, the scriptures, and more. May we ever experience the Risen Jesus through all the Church offers.
