# What's Happening at Church?

Weekly "Our Church—This Week" newsletters have become our primary communication with congregation members and friends. We have been using weekly newsletters since March as a way to adapt to sometimes rapidly changing news that impacts our ministry. Our current format newsletter been 2-front/back sheets of letter size paper. This has been emailed on Mondays or Tuesdays.

Weekly 'Worship Notes' have been used to accompany our weekend worship ministry since we returned to in-person worship, as a way to reduce passing paper out in worship and to give folks at home the choice to print the items we send out. Worship Notes is a single double sided page, but comes with a printout for a bulletin flyer, a Living the Creed at-home activity, and the readings and prayers of intercession. This has been emailed on Fridays.

Email has been our primary connection with all these resources. We know some members prefer to receive this information by mail, and we have been sending out to many members each week. If you have been receiving these updates by email but would prefer to receive a print copy in the mail, please let the office know. We will gladly add you to our physical mailing list.

All seven pages are bundled and mailed on Fridays. Throughout November we will be reviewing our weekly communication as throughout the pandemic we have made minor tweaks to find the best way to share what is happening at church. If we choose additional tweaks, we will begin with Advent. If you have any questions about how the church communicates during this pandemic, please feel free to contact Pastor Jamie. This is an opportunity for conversation, and Pastor Jamie is always open to good conversation.

Christian Education and Youth — Youth Happens at First



The earth is the LORD's and everything in it. The world and all its people belong to him. For he laid the earth's foundation on the seas and built it on the ocean depths.

### Psalm 24:1-2

Farmlands are being harvested as our farmers work tirelessly to bring in this year's crop. New roads are being paved as another construction season winds down. Fall gardening is a task of raking away the old and preparing for a new bloom in the spring. All our efforts give the earth shape and form and color. And all our efforts sometimes lull us into believing the world is our own creation. It is what we have chosen to make of it. We decide where the bulbs go, where the perennials and annuals are planted. We decide the crops and we work the soil with our skill and knowledge. Our urban planners design the roads and craft the cityscapes that are our homes.

And in the midst of all that we control about our environment, we can easily overlook one simple thing. God is creator. We are merely co-creator. That is to say all that we see and live in is first and foremost God's creation. We are gifted with the ability to share in the shaping of our environment, but the environment is God's. We, as co-creators, are really just stewards of what belongs to God.

What does it mean when we remember we are stewards of what belongs to God? It might mean we are prayerful as we consider the natural resources that we use and abuse. It might mean we are faithful as we recycle, reuse and reduce. It might me we give thanks before heading into the field to reap the bounty God's creation provides. It might mean we pause and consider the larger ramifications of the next urban project and civil engineering feat.

Being a steward of what belongs to God should not be an after-thought. It should be our fore-thought. In all we do, in all we use, in all we care for, our faith teaches us to remember that it is all first a gift from God and we are mere stewards of it. Embrace this calling. Embrace this role as co-creator with God, for the earth is all God's and everything in it.
