May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Romans 15:13

The season of Advent is a season of hope, joy, peace, and love. The first Sunday focuses on Hope. In a world filled with much covered negativity, let's give ourselves an opportunity to just focus on hope. Hope is believing something that cannot be seen. St. Paul writes in Romans 8:24 "For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience." Advent offers us a chance to live the fullness of St. Paul's definition of hope.

Hope is the ability to lament the pandemic, yet knowing the pandemic will not win the day. One day, we will return to our normal social gatherings and social structures. One day, our sanctuary will be radiating with the song of hosanna. One day, our masks will be put away as we embrace fully one another without fear of sharing a deadly virus.

Hope is the ability to pick up that phone and cry with a friend as health concerns add worries to an already worrisome time. The shared tears show the bond of Christ unifying friends in shared suffering, and shared strength to get through the unexpected ordeal.

Hope is the ability to mourn the loss of a loved one, to know that there is a hole within your heart that cannot be filled, yet trusting that hole is set into the hands of the very Messiah who also now holds for eternity the very loved one we have peacefully released to his care.

Hope is turning on lights hung on roof eaves, on Christmas trees, and front yard decorations, telling the darkness which comes so early that there is a light in this world, and no darkness can overcome the light of Christ, the light we reflect in the symbols of Christmas lights but also in the reality of giving to the broken, the lost, the needy, through our offerings at church and through other charities.
