Today's Reading

Luke Chapter 3

These two men whose birth stories filled the previous two chapters are now adults, and their work has begun. John's ministry is summarized with brief excerpts from his typical sermons and the description of this baptizing work. We learn his fate is to be imprisoned by Herod, as John spoke out against Herod for many evil acts, including marrying his brother's wife—and mind you, his brother was still alive at the time. Jesus is baptized, though Luke doesn't give much attention to the moment, beyond the Holy Spirit descending upon him and the voice from heaven. This matches Matthew's and Mark's stories as well. The list of Jesus ancestors is listed in this chapter. It is interesting that John is quoted as saying, "Do not say we have Abraham as our ancestor" and then Luke proceeds to show us that Jesus has Abraham as an ancestor.
