Today's Reading

Luke Chapter 19

Here in chapter 19, the narrative shifts from Jesus routine ministry to his entrance into Jerusalem on a day we refer to as Palm Sunday. The palm branches are absent in this telling of Jesus' entrance. But other elements of the story are familiar. Since the four Gospels all tell the story of Jesus entering Jerusalem, it is easy to think we know all the details of the story. Yet the key differences are worth noting—here Jesus rides a colt, not a donkey. Here he weeps over Jerusalem, but does not offer the word of comfort found in Matthew's story. It is important as we read through the Gospels to do some comparative study of the passages, but also to keep in mind this is Luke's story. The details he chooses are important to the story he is telling. These are key details in what Luke wants us to understand about who Jesus is.



Start the Thinking

Have you ever been in a large crowd, trying to see what the whole crowd is trying to see? How do you make yourself larger in those settings? Have you climbed a tree as Zaccheaus did?
