Today's Reading

Mark Chapter 7

We begin this chapter with a confrontation between Jesus and the Pharisees. The Pharisees are bothered that the disciples are eating with defiled hands (meaning they have not been ritually cleaned) and therefore not following the traditions of the elders. Jesus calls them out and tells them they are rejecting God's commandments for the sake of tradition. We then learn from the Syrophoenician Woman that Jesus came not just for the Jews but for everyone regardless of their nationality or background. Our chapter ends with another healing, this time a deaf man. Once again those who saw this were astounded stating, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."

When Jesus get angry or frustrated, it never seems to be at the odd assortment of characters that are coming to him for help. Rather it is the religious leaders and people in authority. Why do you think this is? Do you think the same would be true today as it was back then? Why?
