Today's Reading

Matthew Chapter 28

The story of the resurrection comes with many more questions than it does answers. Compared to the 27 chapters that lead up to this moment, the story of the resurrection is very short. It is filled with conspiracy theories (the soldiers are paid off to lie about the disciples stealing the body), angels and the briefest appearance of Jesus. There is a quick shift away from Jerusalem back to Galilee, and here as the disciples gather we are told some worshipped and some doubted. Another translation might be that the disciples were filled both with a spirit of worship and a spirit of doubt. The Gospel writer knew his audience was certainly filled with both emotions. Perhaps today, you are also. And while the rest of the story may not be fully understood if this is all we had to go on, we are definitely left in good company who share our sense of worship and doubt.
