Today's Reading

John Chapter 3

Today's reading contains perhaps the most famous passage in all of the Bible. The famous John 3:16 verse which has made headlines as a spectator sign at major sporting events for years. The verse is couched in this nighttime visit by Nicodemus who doesn't understand what Jesus means when Jesus says one must be born again. This phrase, too, is extremely popular in Christian cultures, yet its exact meaning is obscure by modern issues surrounding belief. Throughout the Gospel of John the concept of believing is very important. The signs are not what are to believed, but the one who sent Jesus is to be believed. And what we are to believe is that God loves the entire world, all of creation, every microscopic atom, every distant star, every individual mosquito, and every human being. When we believe that, we will understand that we are born again.

John the Baptist continues his ministry even as Jesus begins his. And while Jesus is off at one end of Judea baptizing, John is at another, and people are naturally confused.
