CODE OF CONDUCT FOR BASING ROYALS FC PLAYERS

1. Play because you enjoy, not to please someone else.
2. Always be on time for training/games
3. Game time mentality at all time, no messing around
4. Always wear the correct kit for both training and games
5. Kits must be tucked in before games and boots cleaned
6. Set a positive example for others, particularly your players and supporters.
7. Learn the rules and play by them.
8. Treat opponents with due RESPECT at all times, irrespective of the result of the game.
9. Safeguard the physical fitness of opponents, avoid violence and rough play and help injured opponents.
10. Accept the referee's decision.
11. Do not attempt to mislead the referee by faking an injury, get on with the game.
12. Control your mouth and your temper.
13. Have a team huddle before and after each game.
14. Do not over-react when your team scores a goal.
15. Shake hands at the end of the game, win or lose.
16. TRUST in coaches judgement on positions
17. Make every effort to develop your own sporting abilities in terms of skill, technique, tactics and stamina.
18. Smile and have fun!

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR BASING ROYALS - PARENTS/CARERS AND SPECTATORS.

1. Never force a child to play football: they need to enjoy playing.
2. Praise effort and performance MORE THAN RESULTS.
3. Praise GOOD BEHAVIOUR: quickly show that adults value it
4. Help them understand the rules and encourage your child to play by them.
5. Applaud good play by either team.
6. Do not argue with the referee or question his/her decision, remember he/she is a volunteer giving up their spare time.
7. STAY OFF THE PITCH and do not interfere. Let the referee deal with any situations on the field of play.
8. Do not coach from the sidelines or shout at a child if they make a mistake.
9. Do not use foul or abusive language towards players, officials or spectators.
10. Enjoy watching the game whether your team win or lose.
11. TRUST in coaches judgement on positions
12. Speak privately to the coaches rather than to other parents if you have any concerns, questions or issues.
