As a teacher, I often have to speak with my young students about following rules and making good choices. Truth be told, many of us need to have a talk with our Teacher about our selfish side. We don't want to follow the rules, and we want to do things our own way. We may even feel that our way is best.

God teaches us a different and higher way. He says we are to follow His commands for our own benefit and for His glory. The book of Deuteronomy is full of the Lord's commands to follow Him and do as He says.

Obedience is not measured in percentage points. God doesn't say, "Well done good and faithful servant, you gave 90%!" On the contrary, He says that partial obedience is the same as disobedience. We are either all in or we are not.

Obedience does not talk back to God. It doesn't pick and choose and it doesn't make excuses. It says, "Yes, Lord. I will do what You have asked me to do."

To be obedient, we must learn to LISTEN, SUBMIT and RESPOND. Just like when I talk to my students, I expect them to listen to what I have to say, to change undesired behavior, and to respond differently based on what I have asked them to do. God wants the very same for us. We must listen to hear what He wants us to do, completely submit to Him, and respond immediately.

Have you ever heard Him speaking to you and asking you to do something but didn't respond immediately? We must remember that responding **when we want to** is not complete submission. This is saying that we know best. Our heart must comply and respond both inwardly and outwardly at the same time. This shows that we love God, that we are glad to serve Him, and that He is our priority.

Get still today and ask yourself these questions...

- Am I willing to serve God?
- What stands in the way of me serving Him wholeheartedly?
- Am I showing Him that HE is my priority or that He comes behind other things in my life?
