Over the course of the next several months, things began to change for everyone, and the outlook of travel began to be a hope again. Today, we find ourselves in a unique place. Here at home things are improving and our ability to move around and get back to some normal behaviors has been very refreshing. The whole world is not in that same place.

Throughout the months of the pandemic, we have remained in touch with all of our brothers and sisters in the various locations we have been serving. Although some of those locations are now accessible and travel is allowed, things are not the same as they were in 2019 when we last were there! The pandemic has changed the scope of work on the ground in many places. The protocols and restrictions during these two years have altered the way many are doing ministry in other countries. These changes, along with the issues we still face in travel protocols, have caused us to do some very hard and yet needed introspection. The ministry, as we have known it, for the first twenty years is at a cross road of change. This article is our attempt to be transparent and ask for your help.

Many of you reading this know that One Way Ministries is a dream and vision from the earliest days of ministry in our world. The larger vision for the ministry has always been there, but mostly on the back burner. These days have caused us to think about the other ways that the ministry can be effective and lead out in evangelism and serving others. We have been involved in many different avenues of ministry through the years. Short-term missional experiences have been the primary focus for most of this time. These years of ministry, combined with the experiences we have had with many other strong leaders in our lives, lead us to this point.

In the next several weeks, we will begin exploring the ways One Way can expand its ministry to other areas of work that will continue

the heartbeat of our ministry and meet the needs we have in front of us currently. The primary goal at this point is to remain focused on serving and leading in ministry areas that will reach people with the Gospel message and teach the Word of God boldly as a compliment to the work of the church. One thing that has been at the core of our ministry has been transparency. We typically involve a whole team in making tough decisions on the field. We seek out wisdom from others each time we face a decision that is tough or challenging. This is one of those times. We are reaching out to all of our One Way family to ask for your help in moving forward.

First, we obviously need you to pray with us about the decisions we have to make and the direction we are moving in the coming days. Pray for discernment and wisdom as well as courage to make hard decisions. In addition, we need you to share your wisdom and thoughts. Sometimes the path forward is tough to see while standing in the midst of a storm. We need some of you to share your perspective and views of the ministry and its path to help us gain insight into a broader perspective of where we are, where we have come from, and where we are heading. renovations and construction related opportunities. We will be actively seeking the next steps for One Way in the next few months. Please join us in any way you can as we seek His face and listen for His voice!
