REQUIREMENTS FOR EMT TRAINING:

- **District Resident:** Must verify residency; proof of ID or voter's registration
- **High School Diploma/GED:** Copy of diploma or self attestation accepted
- **Proof of Citizenship:** US Birth Certificate, US Passport or Permanent Resident Card
- **Social Security Number Verification:** Social Security card or government issued document
- **CASAS Test:** 9th grade level or above – (Current CASAS test within a three month period)
- **Police Clearance:** No felony record
- **Valid Driver's License** or ability to obtain Drivers License by completion of course
- Availability for full-time training
- Willingness to work hard to train for a good career
- **Dressed Code:** Business casual

The recruitment event will include:

1. Presentations by ACTA, Inc., orienting participants to careers/career paths for nationally certified EMT-B, the recruitment and training and process, and the commitment required to succeed.
2. CASAS testing provided by ACTA, Inc., and Assessment testing by ACTA, Inc.
3. Prescreening.

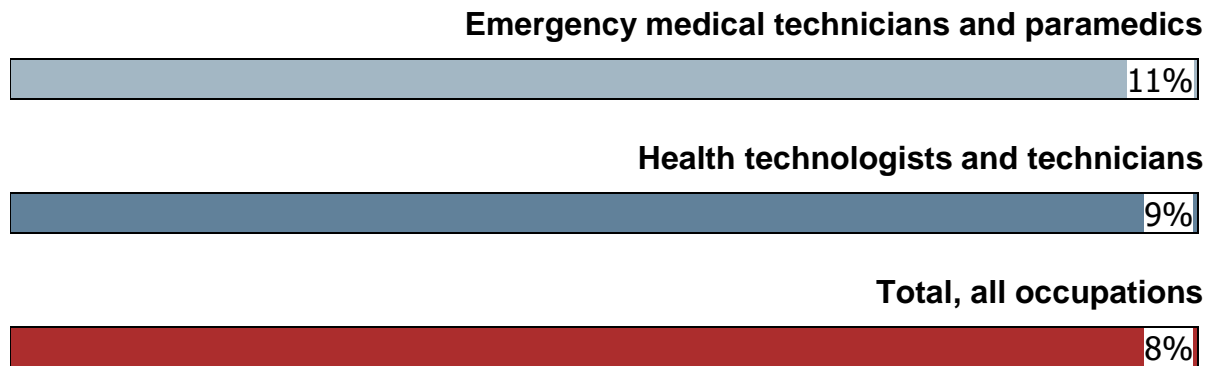
During the second phase of the recruitment process:

- a) Urinalysis Screening
- b) Immunization for TB will be requested and can be provided by Dept. of Health
- c) Proof of Covid Vaccinations (both 1 & 2)
- d) Negative 24 hr. covid rapid test

Job Outlook

EMTs and Paramedics

Employment of EMTs and paramedics is projected to grow 11 percent from 2020 to 2030, faster than the average for all occupations. About 20,700 openings for EMTs and paramedics are projected each year, on average, over the decade.

Employment

Emergencies, such as car crashes, natural disasters, and acts of violence, will continue to require the skills of EMTs and paramedics. Also, growth in the middle-aged and older population will lead to an increase in age-related health emergencies, such as heart attacks and strokes. This increase, in turn, will create greater demand for EMT and paramedic services. An increase in the number of specialized medical facilities will require more EMTs and paramedics to transfer patients with specific conditions to these facilities for treatment.
