- Become educated in the history of Matilda Joslyn Gage and her contributions to the Women's Rights Movement
- Learn about the History of Haudenosaunee Women and how their rights were the model for the U.S. Women's Rights Movement
- Understand the unspoken history and the struggle for their rights by U.S. Women of Color
- Be trained in **Virtual** Dialogue Facilitation and Facilitate **Virtual** Dialogues of your choosing between Gage Ambassadors

- Invite a woman that you respect to be a presenter at a Gage Ambassador's Women in Business and S.T.E.A.M **Virtual** Salon, open to the public. Plan and Facilitate that Salon with a team of Gage Ambassadors.
- Visit the Mohawk Nation, **Virtually**, at Akwesasne for a cultural immersion program in celebration of Gage's recognition of the Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) Indigenous model as the highest form of civilization, and the position of Haudenosaunee women as a model for U.S. women.
