With reference to Section 1 - Statement of Accounts

Box 3 - Other Receipts - This has been increased this year by a total of £10,367. Most of this has come from the grant from the Lottery Fund of £10,000 for the village hall work and the sum of £2,213 from the Transparency Fund towards the costs of equipment, fees and staff costs incurred during the set-up of the web-site and the posting of council material for the period from 1st April 2015 to 31st March 2018, a total gain of £12,213. These increases have been partially offset by reductions totalling £1,846. These came largely from a drop in the income for grass-cutting of £1,481, and in the VAT repayment of £68. The remaining difference is accounted for in the variations in donations towards the Play Area facilities and the History Group funds, which showed a net drop of £297.

Balancing these figures gives a final year-on-year increase of £3.022, the remaining difference occurring in the small variations in other sections of the spending.
