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Executive Summary

The first quarter of 2023 saw the deployment of our marketing strategy for the years 2023/2024. The marketing strategy was created based on the main goals of UCFBIP and the current needs of our business community.

First, for any new readers, what is UCFBIP? UCBIP is the acronym for the University of Central Florida Business Incubation Program. The UCF Business Incubation Program provides business development and operational support to early-stage, innovative businesses throughout Central Florida. Since 1999, this award-winning program has supported hundreds of companies that have collectively generated more than \$400 million in sales and over \$100 million in outside funding.

This non-profit community resource offers three programs that are each designed to help businesses at different stages.

- <u>Traction Program</u>: helps new companies with little to no revenue to build the operational foundation of the business and develop a go-to-market strategy to cultivate an initial customer base. To be eligible, applicants must (1) be headquartered in Central Florida; (2) have a scalable, for-profit business model; and *(3) have a minimal viable product (MVP) or service ready to sell.
- * Grant funding to support research & development is a sufficient substitute for an MVP.
- **Growth Program:** helps companies with existing traction in the market to develop the infrastructure for scaling their business. To be eligible, applicants must (1) be headquartered in Central Florida; (2) have a scalable, for-profit business model; and (3) have already generated revenue from their product or service.
- **Soft Landing Program:** helps international firms and companies headquartered outside the region to support their business development efforts from Central Florida. To be eligible, applicants (1) must be headquartered beyond the Central Florida region; (2) cannot be a franchise; (3) must have at least one full-time business developer from the Central Florida office; and (4) all employees must be authorized to work in the United States.

UCF operates eight incubators across four counties. Many of these facilities serve a broad range of industries. However, the incubators located within UCF's Innovation Districts support companies within specific industry verticals. The Innovation District incubators and their respective industry clusters are listed below:

CENTRAL FLORIDA RESEARCH PARK: Defense/Military, Modeling Simulation & Training, Cybersecurity, Photonics, Robotics, Energy, Space

DOWNTOWN: Digital Media, Smart City Technology, FinTech, EdTech, Hospitality & Tourism Tech

LAKE NONA: Life Sciences, Healthcare, Medical Simulation


In addition to these industry clusters, the UCFBIP has three regional incubators: Kissimmee, Winter Springs, and Volusia County.

About the UCFBIP in Volusia County:

In 2010 the Volusia County Council entered into an agreement with the UCFBIP to create a business Incubator.

According to the project funding agreement, the project will be a mixed-used business incubator. The project is an economic development tool designed to accelerate the growth and success of entrepreneurial companies through business support resources and services developed by the UCFBIP team. On June 29, 2021, the County and UCF Research Foundation signed the Sixth Amendment to extend the term of the Agreement to September 30, 2023. The new amendment extends the services of the Volusia Incubator including the maker space resources and additional workshops. Therefore, the UCFBIP in Volusia County also supports small to mid-size businesses in Volusia County by providing in-person education while fostering relationships in the business community and our local university system so that we can attract entrepreneurs with potentially successful companies.

The expansion of the services provided by the UCFBIP in Volusia County saw the need to spin off the **Volusia Tech Hub**. The Volusia Tech Hub is an online initiative created by the Volusia County - UCF

Business Incubator to attract and inform small business owners and students https://volusiatechhub.com/. Its programs include The Cairns Foundation Innovation Challenge, My School Tech Hub Summer Camps, and the Incubator Maker Lab.



My School Tech Hub Summer Camps:

The UCFBIP in Volusia County partners with MSTH during their Summer Tech Camps to provide technology education to children from 7 - 13 years old. The tech camps are a great way for kids to learn about computer science, coding, 3D printing, robotics, innovation, and entrepreneurship. These topics enlighten students to become more curious and engaged in the technology fields. The summer camps are taught by local college technology students. This initiative has helped us to plant the technology seeds in the minds of young students.


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High Growth Companies



<u>Pre-Incubation Companies</u>: Pre-Incubation companies are prospective businesses that are preparing to become Incubator clients. The pre-incubation process includes the development of the Business Model Canvas (BMC), which is rigorous testing of business model assumptions. In addition, we assist the companies with the refinement of the documents to be attached to the Incubator application. All five applicants we selected to participate in the BMC class for free. The rest of the applicants were referred to SBDC and SCORE (80% were looking for money).


