

Fourth Quarter 2022 Report October 1 – December 31, 2022

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Executive Summary

The fourth quarter of 2022 highlights the organization and execution of the Cairns Foundation Innovation Challenge. This year, I was appointed by the Cairns Foundation Executive Board to be the Chairman of the Cairns Foundation Board, which means I was responsible for the organization of the event, including communicating with local university faculties, a delegation of duties, coordinating the applicant training event after the number of competitors had been narrowed to six finalists, and synchronizing the actual Innovation Challenge. Since we have done this event for the past eight years, the process went smoothly. It was sad to learn during our Board meetings that this was going to be the last Innovation Challenge financed by Dr. Cairns as he is retiring and closing his Foundation. My next task is to find financing for this project in the future.

The 2022 challenge is the ninth edition of the partnership between the Volusia County Business Incubator powered by the UCF Business Incubation Program and the Cairns Foundation.

We received fourteen applications from ERAU, Stetson, and Daytona State College.

The winner is Mckenzi Lyn Flis of Old Trends New Trends. McKenzi is a Stetson student who started her online business in 2020. She resells luxury fashion items. She has sold more than 1,000 items with total revenues of \$425,000 over the past two years.

Luxury items are investments, pieces that can be passed down for generations to come and last a lifetime. Designer quality allows for reselling, revamping, and repurposing, as classic designs ensure they never go out of style and never go in landfills.

The second prize was awarded to another Stetson University student, Erik Libby. Erik owns a business named The To-Do Dudes, which connects seniors with college and high school students for help with household chores. Since its inception, the company has worked with more than 500 seniors, completing more than 2,000 chores and earning nearly \$200,000.

The 2nd place company won \$5,000 and one year of pre-incubation programming at the incubator.

Hearing from these young entrepreneurs is inspiring as they have so many great ideas, concepts, and business plans. This is the future of the Volusia County economy and I'm sure all the students who participated in this year's event will be wildly successful during their careers.

The Cairns Foundation Innovation Challenge launched in 2014 and has awarded more than \$100,000 to aspiring entrepreneurs at area colleges. The funding for the Challenge is part of the Cairns Foundation, which was formed in 2003 by Daytona Beach entrepreneur James Cairns to identify creative students with entrepreneurial potential and to mentor and financially help them achieve technical and commercial success.




Maker-Lab:

Pre-Incubation Companies: Pre-Incubation companies are prospective businesses that are preparing to become Incubator clients. The pre-incubation process includes the development of the Business Model Canvas (BMC), which is rigorous testing of business model assumptions. In addition, we assist the companies with the refinement of the documents to be attached to the Incubator application. All five applicants we selected to participate in the BMC class for free. The rest of the applicants were referred to the SBDC and SCORE (80% were looking for money).


