#### **Summary Report:**

Steve Jobs once said, "Innovation distinguishes between a leader and a follower." At the Volusia County - UCF Business Incubator we strive to guide those innovators who want to lead within our community to be successful. During the first quarter of the year 2015, we have achieved many goals and events that have set up our incubator clients for success and motivated other young leaders within our community. Some of the remarkable accomplished goals were, the launch of our Mentors Program, the Second Annual Innovation Challenge event in Partnership with the Cairns Foundation, and the excitement we lived when we heard the name of one of our incubator graduate clients, First Response Disaster Team, had been called to the stage as the winner in the Small Business Category, on the Bright House Networks Regional Business Awards, in the Greater Orlando area.

The Mentors Program was launched in January 2015. As of today, we have a total of ten mentors from different backgrounds ready to mentor our incubator clients. We have partnered with SCORE, the Small Business Development Center, and local philanthropists to strengthen the incubator services. The program was initiated by our "Art of Mentoring" session. The "Art of Mentoring" was presented by Shane Pegg, Vice President of Strategic Initiatives Accelerator Centre in Waterloo, Ontario, Canada. The Mentors Program creates lasting partnerships, builds core competencies, and allows start-ups to think big, all while providing a quality experience for both mentors and clients.

The Second Annual Innovation Challenge, in partnership with the Cairns Foundation, brought almost 80 people from Volusia County, especially students and faculty members from our local universities. The purpose of the Innovation Challenge is to spotlight technologies created by students from our local colleges and universities. This innovation challenge motivates local young entrepreneurs and innovators with great business ideas to become the next multi-million dollar enterprises. The first place award of \$10,000, donated by the Cairns Foundation, was awarded to TSOLife LLC, and the second place award of \$5,000, donated by the Hunter Charitable Foundation, was awarded to Xeres. Both winning teams were from Stetson University in DeLand. TSOLife LLC was also awarded a free year of business mentoring services and an office space at the incubator. The second place winner will receive six months pre-incubation program. I'm very eager to guide our local, young entrepreneurs, in a successful direction.

Lastly, I would like to congratulate First Response Disaster Team, on their first place honors in the inaugural Bright House Networks Regional Business Awards, in the Greater Orlando area. The organization was honored for their products, services, and leadership that have impacted the community. We were able to provide First Response Disaster Team with the tools and resources it needed to compete in the market and create new jobs in the area. Due to the program's resources and the team's strategic guidance, they have grown from a two- to ten-person operation within a year and are continuing to expand. They have recently opened up a new office branch in Orlando. Their future goal is to go national.


